The ribbon was cut by the mayor of Manly, Councillor Jean Hay, who in a short speech recalled her early days around the club when it was still a swimming baths. The mayor then joined members of the board and other dignitaries for refreshments where we discussed the growth of the club and our engagement with the local community.

We really, really, really need people for the 19th January, 2nd and 16th February, with more places available in March and April. It is easy to get on board, send an email to dutyroster@myc.org.au with your preferred date. Those new to racing should learn from the old timers – they either volunteer their crew, or they volunteer themselves when they know they don't have crew to race so they can claim average points. The worst case scenario is if the race committee does not have enough members, then boats that have not volunteered themselves will be roped in thereby having to forego a race and receive average points. Towards the end of the season, this may not help a campaign to take home the big trophy.

For those that love land better than water, there are land based roles that need to be filled, both on Sunday, but especially for Friday twilights. 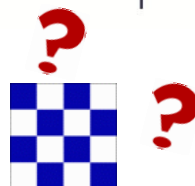




Race 4 Summer Series
