PAUL GLASER
1938-2014


Paul first learnt to sail on Vee Jays in 1952 and 1953 as a teenager.


He came to competitive sailing in his early twenties when he bought a Soling with Denis Power in 1968. Paul competed with Rex Dengate and Power as skipper sailing in Division Two from Middle Harbour Yacht Club. Over the next twenty years Paul competed in a range of local regattas building up through the State and National titles. 


In 1989 he was part of the Australian Soling Class Crew that competed in the Soling Class World Championships in Hungary. 

In 1992 he was manager of the Australian team at the Soling World Championships in Holland. 

Paul was official measurer for the Soling Class at the Pre-Olympics and the Sydney 2000 Olympics and an on-water judge. Manly Yacht Club members assisted him during this time. Paul was a member of the Yachting Association of NSW Foundation, which raises funds for youth, disabled and Olympic Class Sailors. 

In 1998 he was awarded the Geert Gakker Award for services to the International Soling Class. He also received the Premier's Award for Services to Sport and the Community and the Centenary Award in 2003. 

Paul was President of The Australian International Soling Association for many, many years. He represented the Australian Solings at meetings here in Australia and overseas. After the Sydney Olympics, he and David Parle bought Neville Wittey's training Soling, *Nortel*, and sailed at Manly Yacht Club. 

Ivana Gattegno wrote "He was a very helpful enthusiastic person concerning the Solings. He had a wealth of knowledge and seemed to know every Soling in Australia including who sailed on them, Paul was the first person contacted when I bought my Soling, and his support was fantastic I remember him handing me all the Tuning Guides and information; and his offers of help and great stories about the class". 

Paul was a successful businessman and held prominent positions in the Airline and travel industries before his retirement.

Lots of lead and position changes made for competitive racing and kept spectators on the edge of their gunwales.

Day 2 weather was almost too perfect – sunny and clear with very light and variable winds. Winds were so light that the race committee only got a race started at 2.30pm – 3 hours behind schedule. Then unfortunately it had to be abandoned as the fleet only progressed centimetres over the start line. 10 minutes later we gave up and headed home. Still, all was not lost – kids had a blast swimming and playing games with their boats while parents got some desperately-needed chill-time.

At the top of the open fleet the competition was very close in the first half of both races with 5 boats having a taste of the lead at some point – *Another Dark and Stormy* (Alex Hart), *Firefly* (Hugo Taranto), *Five Star* (Alastair Hunter), *Shotgun* (Jake Barnabas) and *Wicked* (Jesse Dransfield). However, *Firefly* prevailed in both and took 2 out of 2 wins. For further results have a look at the results page.

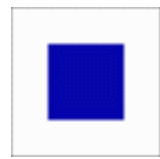

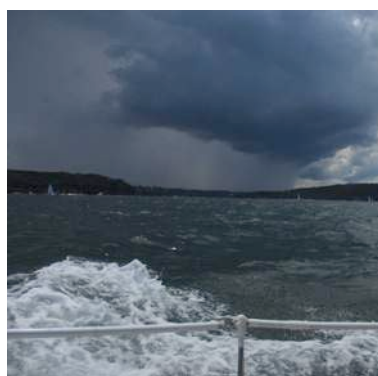

PEPPER TREE WINES CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES



After five races, this season's Club Championship may be half-way run but it's far from being won.

The Commodore's speedy Archambault, Esprit, leads division 1 with a total score of 11 points but hot on their heels sit Shear Magic, Pam and Ten Sixty, all on 13. Two points further back is Two Can, and bringing up the rear of the fleet is Wild Life on an uncharacteristic score of 19. The corrected time spread between the first four boats in Race 5 was a paltry three minutes over a two-hour race, proving that one bad tack can cost you dearly at this point in the season.

In division 2, two boats are dominating ... Sip Ahoy (11 points) and Aida (12), but there is only three points between the next five yachts: Ratty Tooley and Runaway Taxi are on 20, Kaotic is on 21.3, Melody on 22 and Old Habits Never Die (23). The time spread for race 5 was even keener than the bigger boats' result, with a tad over three minutes between first and fifth place and just four seconds separating the winner (Aida) and second place (Taxi).

So what does it all mean? Well, one thing is for certain, you can blame your skipper, the boat, the weather, the crew and even the cat, but from now on, you can't blame the handicapper.

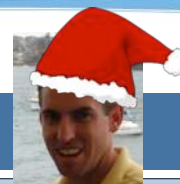

MYC HISTORY – DARING DEEDS

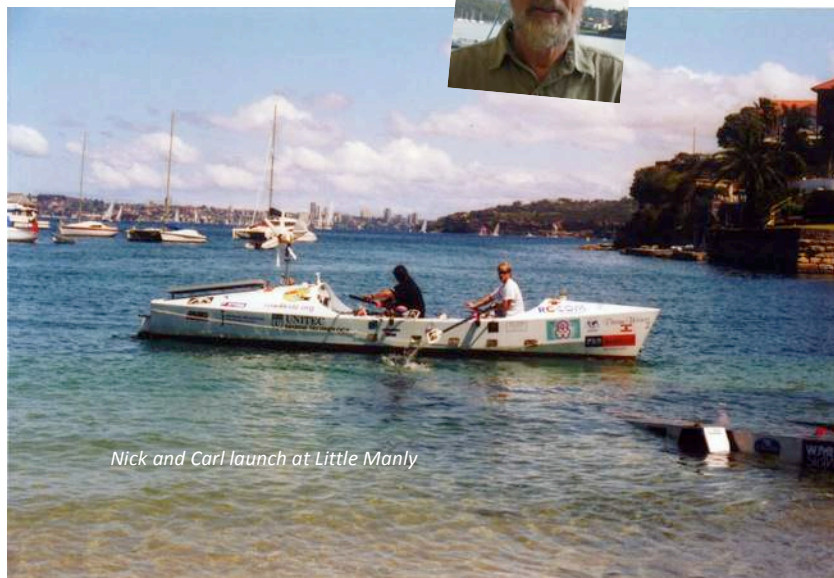


THE ROWERS



In October 2002 two New Zealand adventurers, Nick Barbara and Carl Dickens, decided to row 1,300 nautical miles across the Tasman Sea from Sydney to New Zealand. Their aim was to raise awareness for the plight of poor children in New Zealand. In so doing they would become the first ever to row across the Tasman Sea from West to East. In order to establish a base in Sydney they contacted Bruce Hitchman, a fellow Kiwi, for assistance and MYC became their base.

'*Dreamweaver 11*' their rowing boat is 7.7 m long and has two rowing stations tandem fashion with an enclosed space under a raised deck at bow and stern. They could lie down for a sleep one at a time. They planned to start from MYC in the early evening and a helicopter with cameras had been booked to film the event. As it happened within 200m of the Club one of the foot rests broke and they had to return for repairs. By the time it was fixed it was dark and the helicopter had gone. So Bruce Hitchman and Brian Wilson offered to tow them out to the Heads with *Pacific Breeze*. This was considered reasonable because they were still within Sydney Harbour.

About 3 days later, early in the morning, Bruce received word from an anxious kiwi wife that the pair were in serious trouble in the middle of the Tasman Sea. Radio contact had been lost. He immediately planned a rescue mission in *Pacific Breeze* with Brian Wilson. Bruce went to ready the yacht and Brian went to the supermarket to buy supplies. Half way through his shopping he was astonished to see his wife, Jenny, running down the aisle still wearing her nightdress.

"Stop" she cried, and then went on to explain that the police had been in touch and put a stop to the *Pacific Breeze* rescue mission. Brian back-tracked through the supermarket replacing his intended purchases. Jenny, who had collided with the Mayor of Manly, Jean Hay, on her flight down the aisle went back to try and explain her unusual dress.

Meanwhile, 240 nautical miles out in the Tasman Sea, *Dream Weaver* had capsized and was floating upside down.

For two days the rowers had clung to the bottom suffering from dehydration (they could not reach their water supply) and hyperthermia. They had used up all their flares and only the last one had actually worked. They were at the end of their tether, completely exhausted and on the point of giving up and letting go.

However, by an absolute fluke, the Sydney tuna trawler, *Japara*, was in the area and spotted the flare.

They were rescued and that was a miracle in itself because the *Japara* was not in regular fishing waters or a recognised sea-lane. *Japara* took them to Lord Howe Island. From there they flew back to Sydney and were reunited with their anxious wives.

That was Nick and Carl's second attempt to row across the Tasman Sea. The first attempt, from East to West, ended when the two rubber duckies towing *Dreamweaver* out through the surf were swamped and *Dreamweaver* was tipped broadside.

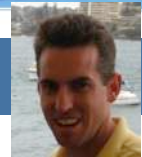

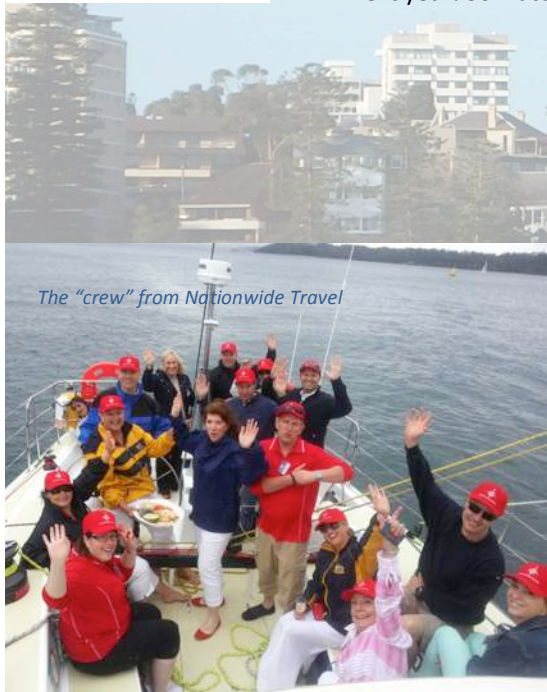
In return they enjoyed an afternoon aboard the mighty *Eureka II* and we are pretty sure a good time was had by all!

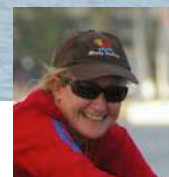

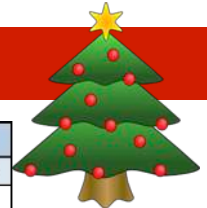
