



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

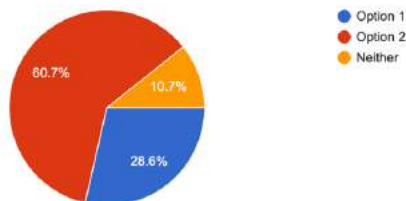

MHYC already mandate this, and we will align by mandating radio watch next season for the duration of the races.

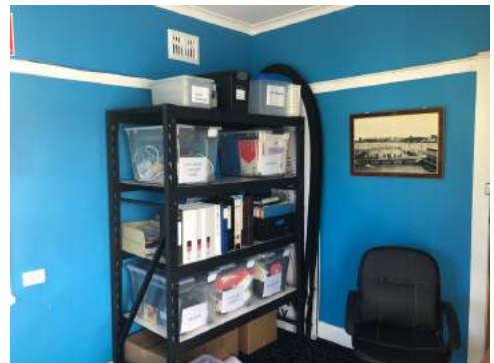
Marks being missing, or courses being shortened are an inevitability on our race track, and VHF notifications are a pragmatic method of keeping the fleet notified of changes.

Some of the smallest yachts of the MYC fleet dominated the recent Mini Regatta 1, which was held in light and fluky winds over five short windward-leeward courses on Manly Cove on October 13.

The race committee knew they'd have a difficult day when they saw the BOM forecast of breezes under 10 knots shifting from the southeast to northeast for the whole day. The AP flag got a good workout, as did the boys on *Robbie R*, who dropped and raised marks for most of the day as the courses shifted. PRO Graham Radford later commented that it had been the most difficult mini regatta he had done, and he's been involved in most since the concept began many years ago. In a small but perfectly formed fleet of seven, *Kaotic* was quick out of the box, claiming the first one-lap sprint on handicap, with Catherine Thornton-Rofe at the helm. The mighty midget *Melody* drifted in to second place, with Jan Bartel steering *Esprit* to third spot. Race 2 saw that wise old dog Bruce Davis craftily weave *Wildlife* through the numerous wind holes for the win, with *Kaotic* and *Esprit* again scoring podium spots in a race that took about half the time of the opener.

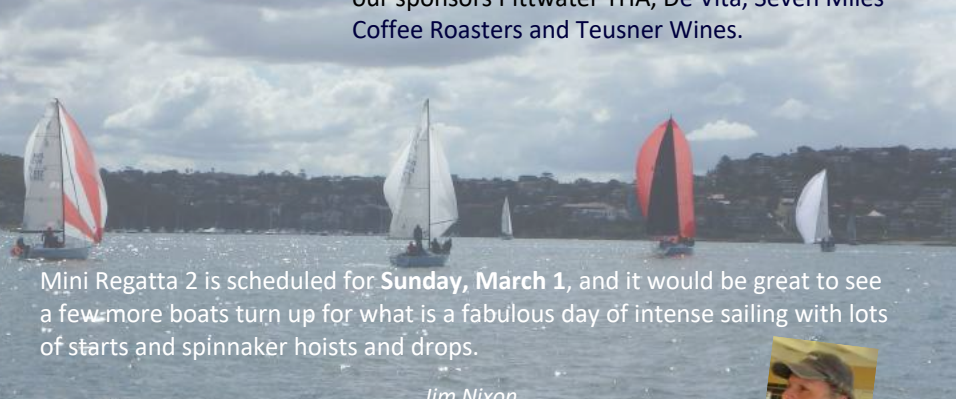

Race 3 likewise had some breeze and with it a change in fortune for *Junior* (Ray Carless) and *Cheap Thrills* (Barry Mifflin), who claimed the honours with *Kaotic* again nipping at their heels. Race 4 saw *Melody*, with event sponsor Michael Doherty from Pittwater YHA steering, come home with a wet sail for the win and the big boat of the fleet, *Sirius* (Garth Riley), finally getting into gear, with *Junior* and *Kaotic* dead heating for third. The handicaps finally kicked in for the big boats in the last race of the day, with *Sirius* ahead of *Wildlife* and *Junior*. Overall results for the day saw Catherine take home the big bag of coffee for *Kaotic* (15.5 points), ahead of *Junior* (16.5) and *Melody* (17). As always, big thanks go out to our sponsors Pittwater YHA, De Vita, Seven Miles Coffee Roasters and Teusner Wines.

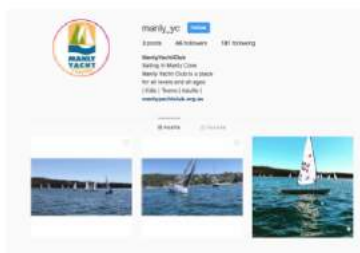

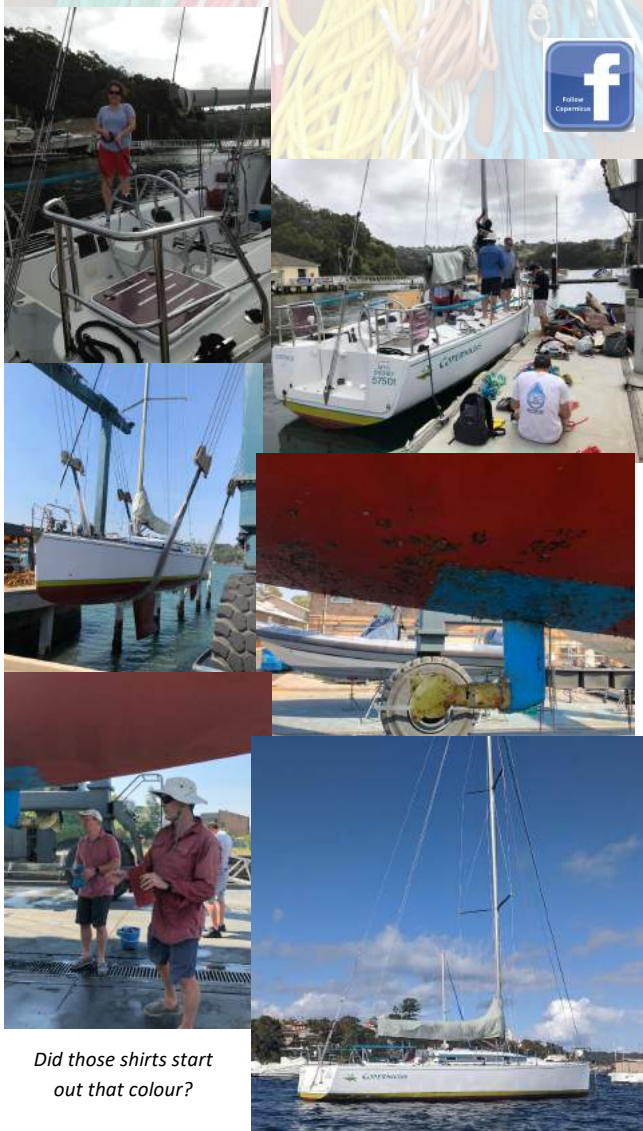

A few weeks ago, we assisted a capsized catamaran.

This called on all the training for Man Overboard:



- Emergency kite drop
- Clearing lines
- Motor back to assist vessel and crew
- Emergency radio procedures
- Dealing with rescue helicopters
- Marine Rescue
- Water Police.

The drills don't get any more real than a real rescue.

Just the other day our First Aid skills were called upon to assist friends on the water: What do you do when presented with a person who has fainted, is covered in a rash and feeling nauseous? Precisely what we have been trained for.

MOB, Radio, First Aid, Sea Survival.

All well worth learning and keeping up to date.

Over 250 youth sailors attended and included a large fleet of 50 Lasers. And is evidence that the Laser is going from strength to strength as a youth class. More info here ...

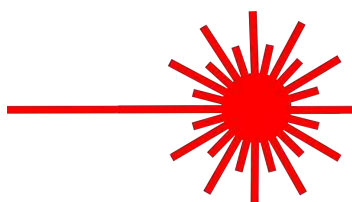

MAYBE SOME TIPS FOR OUR SENIORS?

Starting Sequence Cheat Sheet

Every race will have a 5 minute starting sequence. This document is to help sailors and parents learn how to have the best start possible. For new racers this is a good way to remind yourself about starting sequences. I suggest using a watch if you can that has a timer setting on it, you can align your watch with the Race Committee's countdown so you know how long till go!

Starting Sequence Countdown:

Time	Sound	Flag	Where to be	What to do
5 mins	1	Class flag up	Near the course.	If you have a watch set the 5 minute timer at the same time as the Race Committee.
4 mins	1	Prep flag up *	Staying close to the course.	Use this time to look at the wind on the course and where the marks are.
3 mins			Luffing or sailing behind or beside the start line.	
2 mins			Closely behind the start line.	Find your spot on the start line. Wedge yourself into a spot and luff there.
1 min	1 long	Prep flag down	Closely behind the start line.	Keep your spot. Make sure when you start sailing you will be on a starboard tack.
30 sec			Closer to the start line.	Start putting your sail controls on and pulling your main in to gain speed.
5-10 sec			Right behind the start line.	At 5-10 seconds you should be sailing quickly right towards the start line.
GO	1	Class flag down	Crossing the start line on starboard tack!	Be sailing as fast as you can and having fun!

* Some away regattas may use a P, I, Z, U or Black flag at this time. MYC does not use them but we will go over them in a lesson at a later date.

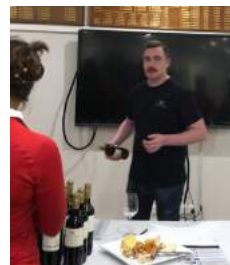



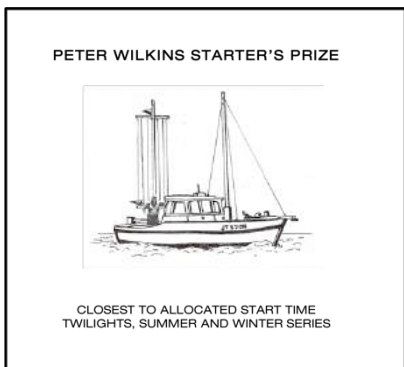
