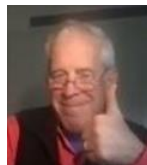

I would like to thank everyone who attended the comedy night / AGM. It was a great evening full of laughs and I'm pleased to announce that we raised \$645 for our junior programme. This coupled with the \$5000 that we that we received from Local Sport Grant Program 2021-22 will fund a new RIB for our junior programme.

I am delighted to announce Kim English will take over as our Venue Hire Manager in August. Kim has an extensive background in sales and marketing particularly in the wedding industry. Kim's connection with MYC began when her son, Luke, joined our Junior program in 2018. We are very excited to have her onboard. I want to acknowledge the incredible work that Clare Smart has put into the role over the last 8 months. Clare has established several key strategic relationships with Registry NSW, Meet in Manly and Manly Pacific which have bolster our enquiries and bookings. She has been responsible for a significant growth in bookings over the last six months during a time when venue hire is still being impacted by COVID.

ANNUAL REPORT

At the AGM I announced some provisional results regarding our financials for 2022. These financials have now been completed and the finalised loss for the year was 35,418. This was due to the significant downturn in our hall hire revenue. The difference in the amount initially reported was that the income for future venue hire bookings had yet to be accrued as next year's income. So, whilst we have made a loss for last financial year the number of bookings has increased, and we expect to return to profit this year. We now have over 30 bookings between now and the end of the year and hope to achieve a 75% booking rate for all available Saturdays over the summer.

The full annual report will be distributed in the next week.

NOTICEBOARD



SAFETY BRIEFING

Tuesday, 16 August 2022, 7pm-9pm

This is a mandatory briefing at the beginning of each season for the benefit of Skippers. Interested crew may also attend.

The Safety Briefing will include:

- a brief rules overview of Racing Rules of Sailing and the Col Regs. A detailed Racing Rules of Sailing session is organised in October.
- Club Safety Orientation including where the safety equipment is and what the safety procedures are
- Fleet Safety Orientation, including MYC racing requirements, ferry exclusion zones and finish lines
- Duty Roster requirements

This session will be videoed for skippers to view if unavailable to attend in person.

The Safety Briefing Declaration is a required document for entry to any racing at MYC and should be completed and signed after attendance at the meeting or after viewing the video, before uploading into the SailSys race entry system.

EQUIPMENT AUDIT DAY

Saturday, 20 August, 9am-1pm

Please make sure you reserve this date in your diary, have all your items up to date and in good repair.

Before presenting your boat for inspection check that it fits all the requirements for the latest audit category form. These forms can be downloaded from www.sailing.org.au or the MYC web site.

Additionally, all yachts need to comply with RMS safety equipment requirements as listed in General Conditions of racing 7.3.4 in the [new handbook](#).

The usual two venues will be available for inspections, Davis Marina and MYC jetty.

For boats inspected at Davis Marina please be aware that visitors on the day must only use the work berth, one boat at a time and wait until they are called. Clients registered with a boat on the marina or mooring can use other facilities such as pick up, dinghies and tender service.

All gear should be neatly laid out and the appropriate Category form completed. Make sure everything is in good condition, clean and all up to date. Following the inspection, it is the owners' responsibility to have the signed audit form submitted to MYC.

Particular attention should be paid to inflatable PFDs ensuring that they have been serviced in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Proof of service is required for such PFDs. Self-service of inflatable PFDs requires that the paper record for each PFD is kept on board the vessel.

BRUCE PAGE

1930-2022

A TRUE GENTLE MAN

I remember Bruce Page well. Often there would be three Bruces: Page, Hitchman and Davis all together.

I think I took over as Commodore from Bruce in 1987 ... but I am not certain. He gave me a handover at his house in Frenchs Forest. The Commodore's records consisted of a small cardboard box with a few pieces of paper. One piece of paper had the original copy of the MYC courses drawn by Brian and adorned with a sketch of his first yacht *Kurrawa*. Really, I was given a clean slate.

Bruce was a friendly and charming gentleman, very mild mannered, calm and as Commodore not fussed with detail. He could sail well and never got into trouble but wasn't particularly competitive. He worked in the food industry and was some sort of technologist, I think in charge of a large team? It appeared to me that he made a living from processed foods but didn't seem to be interested in eating them rather preferring fresh food. When he came to the marina, he would have a cup of tea or maybe coffee never ate the biscuit.

We competed against him on *Ffylliceti four* in our Swanson Dart called *Rumours*. After the race he would go back to the club and sit on the upper deck and work out the handicap results with a pencil, paper and calculator.

However, I do remember him doing long multiplication so maybe the calculator was left at home sometimes.

The workings were handed around the crowd and then put back in the cardboard box. Bruce taught us how to lay marks and handle support boats and his lessons then are still relevant today.

At Christmas he and Eunice would often cruise on Broken Bay with Hallett's Beach being a popular meeting spot for MYC members on New Year's Eve with a fire on the beach. Pam and I took the Dart to Pittwater one year and had afternoon tea with them before returning to Careel Bay and our temporary mooring. Overnighting on the Dart was not an option.

During the 1988 bicentenary Bruce took part in the tall ships passage from Jervis Bay to Sydney. They berthed *Ffylliceti four* in Darling Harbour and took part in the festivities. Years later when Bruce decided he was too old to continue sailing, he asked me to sell his boat. At that stage Davis Marina was actively selling second-hand boats on commission and we found a buyer in reasonable time. I meet up with him several times after the sale when his daughter and son in law had a boat at the marina.

Bruce was an instantly likeable man, generous and capable and I'm sure he will be missed.

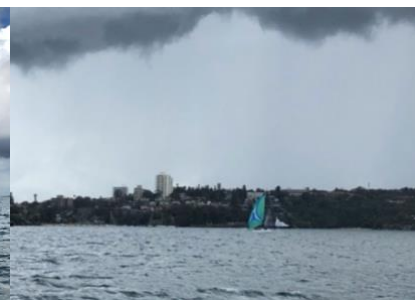
In division 2, *Day Break* - first race in this series - fastest around the course and first on handicap, *Kaotic* coming in second with *Pompadi* third on handicap.

Bokarra was a family affair with grandfather Colin, son Iain and the two grandchildren, Hamish and Felicity, as crew got them the handicap win in Division 2.

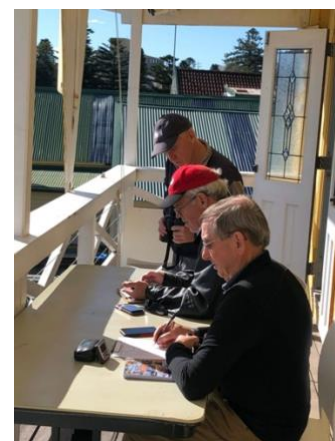

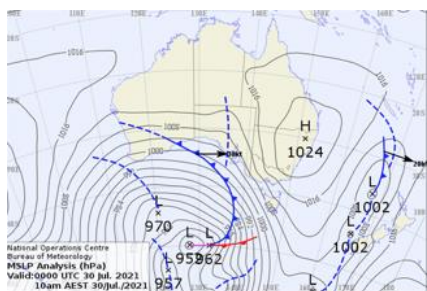

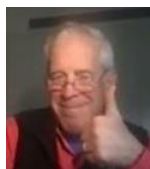

The mother replied, "I'm Monica - my little girl's name is Tammy."

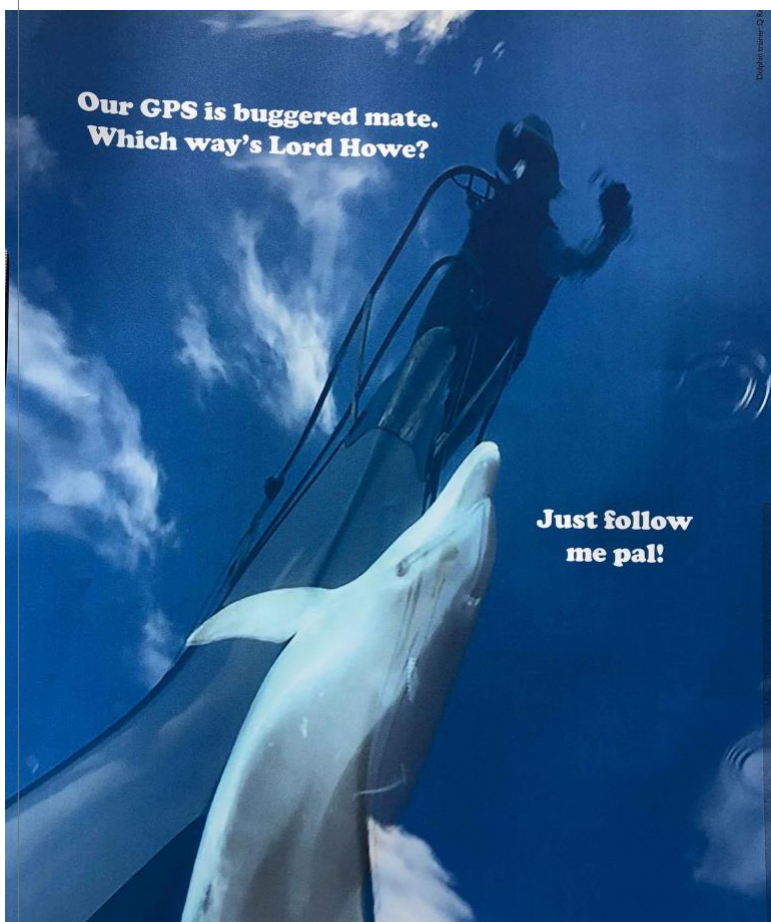

The total project cost for the new **SROS** boats was **\$26,500**.
