# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I hope this newsletter letter finds you well and enjoying the start of the year. I wanted to provide a few updates and changes happening around the club.

Firstly, I'm sure many of you were surprised by the loss of both tenders out of North Harbour Marina and the Boatshed, as well as the cancellation of the Round Around club last year. It certainly caught us off guard. Since then, our focus has been on ensuring that all skippers and crews can still access their yachts for MYC racing, while also providing support during the holiday period as needed. We've been taking some time to evaluate the needs of skippers and crews and how best to run the tender service in the future. While we're still finalizing our decision, I can share that we believe this service is now a core part of the club's offerings to members. As such, we're leaning towards making it available to all members without a pay-per-use model. We feel strongly that the cost of this service should be shared by all members, not just skippers. Additionally, we're exploring the possibility of extending this service to non-members who were previously part of the run-around club. We hope to share more details with you in early March.

On another note, we need to address some repairs to the wharf. We'll be replacing a few pontoons, which has required us to apply for a Development Application (DA) due to changes in regulations since our last repair. It's been a lengthy and costly process, with numerous reports required for the submission. We've submitted the DA and are currently awaiting approval.



# COMMODORE'S REPORT

It's been a long time between reports so there is a lot to mention.

We are more than halfway through our summer season.

I am pleased to report that most events in our summer program have been well attended.

25+ yachts in most Twilights (*Sirius* leading the point score), 10 yachts in our Club Championships (*Absolut* leading the point score) and typically 7-8 yachts in the Summer Series. It is interesting to note that *Okavango Delta* is winning the Summer Series point score.

For those who don't know, *Oka* was purchased by 3 ex juniors Macie, Will, and Charlie who were all 15 at the time of purchase. Our training must have worked.

The junior program is going well with 14 new juniors joining mid-season.

We had quite a few members sail in last year's Sydney to Hobart under quite challenging conditions with two MYC yachts participating. *Enigma* Jason Bond (Rear Commodore) and *Mondo* with Lisa (President) and Stephen (Commodore). *Mondo* did quite well to beating all of the other Sydney 38's in the fleet. Additionally, *Mondo* has come second in the CYCA Blue Water point score behind *Comanche*.

### **AMENDMENT TO THE SPECIAL REGULATIONS FOR FIRE EXTINGUISHERS AND EMERGENCY STEERING**

Published Sun 05 Nov 2023


Amendments to the Special Regulations have been issued concerning emergency steering and inspection of fire extinguishers. The amendments are:

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS - this amendment removes a non-binding explanatory note which may have led stakeholders to take an unnecessarily prescriptive approach to compliance when inspecting fire extinguishers. The note

has been changed to a Safety Information Notice here.



**EMERGENCY STEERING** – this amendment aligns the Australian position Special Regulations with World Sailing's Offshore Special Regulations by applying the requirement only to category 1 to 3 races, and then shifts the requirements for practicing these steering methods to the training section; the latter element is administrative. Information about emergency steering can be read in an article published on 17 August 2023.



Both changes relieve the burden on boat owners and their crews.

Amendments to the Special Regulations are here.







# SAILABILITY AUSTRALIA DAY REGATTA

FRIDAY, 26 JANUARY 2024



With heat wave conditions forecast earlier in the week and the winds looking a bit "iffy", there was some discussion about starting. The morning wasn't as hot as predicted and the breeze was a NW at 10-15knts when 6 Hansa 303s hit the water. Good to go... so far ...

Meanwhile, the start line was set, and the buoys were laid for a pretty accurate sausage/triangle course 2, thanks Warwick and Joe.

Race one and a clear start as all 6 boats contested the start line. By the time the boats were at the top mark, the westerly had picked up but still good to go! All marks were hotly contested, and the finish was

A frustrating forecast for the race committee today, finally settling on Course 1. This course takes the fleet the Edwards, Cannae and then down to Shark and Clark before scooting across to Wedding Cake east and then home.

With an almost half hour difference in start time between the first boat and the last the weather made some interesting "adjustments" during the race. Those coming around Cannae and choosing the western shore to make their way to Shark Island hit a few softer spots than those who chose the eastern shore. Both strategies were tricky, but the eastern shore won out. San Toy sprang (briefly) to the lead while Mondo struggled for air. 
