"MYC, I've just done the rounds of the Manly sailors and can report big smiles everywhere. Seems they're having the time of their lives. Nigel, out".

This exchange took place during a brief rest on an otherwise full racing schedule on Day 2 of the NSW O'pen BIC championship. It perfectly sums up what was a brilliant regatta.



A fleet of 10 sailors –20% of the overall fleet – ably represented MYC from our Junior & Youth Division in the Club's first official O'pen BIC event. Our hosts the Royal Motor Yacht Club, Broken Bay, turned on everything you could wish for in terms of hospitality. Impeccable organisation and a strong crew of volunteers saw 9 races completed by both the Gold and Silver fleets.

Pittwater provided a challenging 12-15 knot NE under ominous, heavy cloud for the first day. In contrast Day 2 saw a tricky 9-12 knots and finished under bright sunshine.

The sailors were tested out of the blocks each morning with a 2 nautical mile work straight into a classic Pittwater Nor-Easter just to get to the course area. Not much to the crew of *Esprit*, but bear in mind that most of the fleet are lighter and younger than a couple of cases of properly aged Barossa Shiraz. Our sailors are 4-6 years shy of Learner Driver Permits but they pilot a craft just 2.75m long powered up by a 4.5sqm, square-top K.Film polyester rig, shaped by full-battens. The hull, with an open transom and arrow shape, draws comparisons to large skiffs.



Our Gold fleet representatives were Evie Saunders, Will Divola, George Thompson and Oliver Martyn. The overall regatta winner was possibly a forgone conclusion with Kristen Wadley from Tinaroo Sailing Club in Queensland arriving at RMYC with a swag of State and National gongs and TWO WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS in the class. This gave our sailors an opportunity to test themselves against the best in the world and it's testament to the quality of Australian youth sailing that competition amongst the Gold Fleet was tight.

Whilst Kristen took the U16 with a low score of 7 from 7 races, MYC's Will Divola took 3rd in the U16 Gold Fleet, having traded 2nd and 3rd place throughout the regatta and narrowly missing 2nd overall. Will is one of the hardest working sailors in the Division and thoroughly deserved his podium finish in the blue ribbon age group.

With six sailors, MYC made up a quarter of the Silver Fleet: Zara Laird, Benjamin Fairbrother, Thomas Rees, Maximilien Holland, Matt Popit Tursic and Sam Blair.

This being the first regatta of any description for many of these sailors, expectations were for great experiences and improvement rather than silverware.

But it seems somebody forgot to tell 12-year-old Sam Blair. After a tough first day of the regatta Sam was lying in the middle of the fleet. With that experience and a good night's sleep under his belt, Sam sent a message in the first race of Day 2 leaving all in his wake to record a victory. Consistent performances throughout the rest of the afternoon saw Sam step up come the presentation to claim 4th place in the Silver Fleet.

The regatta was a great experience and the healthy representation of MYC by our fleet points to a strong future for the club. Equally important the weekend was characterized by sportsmanship, smiles and laughter. It was a baptism by fire under heavy cloud for most of our fleet but there is no doubt a new batch of regatta-hardened sailors emerged into the sunshine of Sunday afternoon.

The Start Boat commented that the starts were hotly contested with most of the fleet getting their starts bang on. There were only 2 recalls all day (who shall remain nameless) and there were many duels to the death on the hairy, short downhill kite runs to the finish.

As always, none of this could have happened without a hard working team of volunteers behind the scenes. Especially a Mini Regatta, with 5 starts, 5 finishes, multiple buoys to be laid and dead to windward adjustments to make for crack racing. Many thanks go out to the race committee.

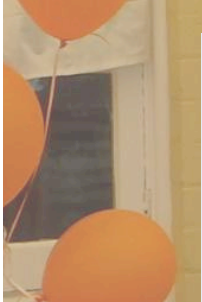
# PITTWATER YHA MINI REGATTA – DAY 1

Since the last Newsletter the Laser Fleet has crowned a new Spring Point Score Champion; completed 3 more Club Championship heats; sailed heats 5-8 of the Laser Mini Regatta and welcomed 3 new boats into the fleet which now stands at 21!

The 2015/16 Season Spring Point Score was wrapped up and Ian Saunders (*Sirjje*), held onto the silverware by 8 points with a 4<sup>th</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> (dropped), ahead of Ed Wray (*Tequila*) and Iain Cameron (*Seanile*), just .8 points back in 3<sup>rd</sup>. Well done, guys on a great series.

Sunday Nov 29<sup>th</sup> was heat 8 of the Club Championship and the final heat of the Spring Point Score, and saw a record, 17 boats start the long course race. The start was very tight and Peter Bremner (*Little Miss Giggles*), sailed like a man possessed and rounded the top mark in 4<sup>th</sup>. He managed to hang on in the top group to record a 5<sup>th</sup> on scratch and take out the race on handicap. Not bad for someone that turned up late and rigged on the deck without a dolly or rack. Ed got the bullet ahead of Iain Cameron & Phil Reid.

Heat 9 of the Club Championship saw Iain Cameron unable to contend the race which left Phil, Ian & Ed in a position to pounce on the single point on offer. Ed suffered gear damage and headed home which allowed Phil to take the win ahead of Ian Saunders. Sean O'Dwyer (*Twocando*) surprised everyone including himself to take the bronze, followed closely by Garth Riley (*Cheeky*).

Heats 5-8 of the Laser Mini Regatta was sailed on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> December; with the Juniors including the impressive Bic fleet, it was also the centreboards Christmas BBQ which Sean O'Dwyer excelled and putting together, thanks Sean. Iain Cameron (*Seanile*) has a very commanding lead in the series with six 1<sup>st</sup>s and two 2<sup>nd</sup>s, however Ian Saunders isn't done just yet only 5 points back and snatching the 8<sup>th</sup> heat in a close one. Ed Wray who was on duty carries average points into heats 9-12 only 2 points behind Ian so the final series will be tight especially with Ed sailing his new boat.

The fleet also welcomes Sam Jackson (*Sam*), Ben Thompson (*Tequila*) & Dave Thompson (*Cheeky*) to the fleet and it was great seeing *Tom Yum* make a rare appearance in the Cove. Also spec' mention to Nick Docker who sailed very competitively in the 4.<sup>th</sup> the Mini Regatta heats while his Dad commanded Carlyle.

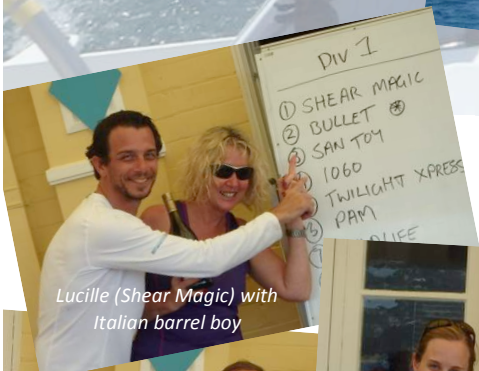

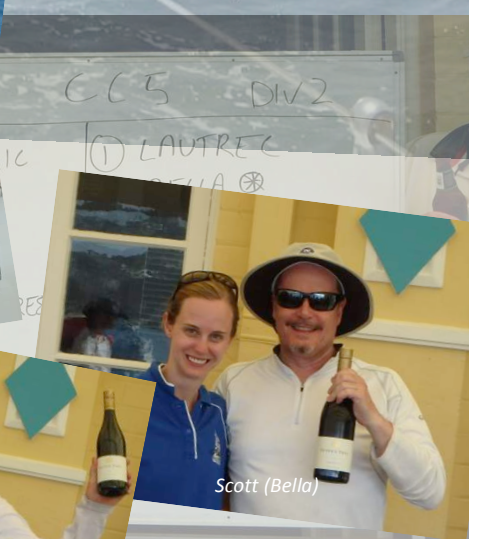

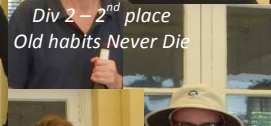

## HISTORY – EVOLUTION (Brian Wilson with help from Gene Scott)

The November 2013 History article in the Club Newsletter describes how MYC evolved from the Manly Sailing Club, which was founded around 1922. The Skiff Club and the North Harbour Sailing Club evolved from the Sailing Club as well. Initially Manly Yacht Club was called the Manly 14ft Sailing Club which was established in September 1950 and the boat of choice was the 14ft skiff. It was not until 1965 that the Club was incorporated and the name was changed to Manly Yacht Club.



The late Keith Smith, a man who sailed 14ft Manly Graduates well into his 70's, states that the golden age of Manly Yacht Club was, in fact, the age of the 14ft skiffs... the time when Alan Rann was the first, but not the last, member of the Club to become the Australian 14ft National Champion.

Over the years Manly Yacht Club has changed from off the beach sailors whose headquarters ranged from Laurie Farrell's boatshed (demolished) at Little Manly Cove to Stuarts Boatshed (demolished) in Manly Cove next door to the Manly Rowing and Sailing Club to the present day where it leases the old Manly Baths Building from Manly Council. This transaction took place in 1980.

The Baths building became derelict after the great storm of 1974 that destroyed the actual 50m swimming pool, and damaged Stuart's Boatshed. So the Club made a momentous decision to relocate into the Baths building. The Council, at that time, was very glad that MYC leased the Baths building. It meant a derelict building was off its hands.

At that time The Digger's Swimming Club was occupied a two-story building located between the old Baths building and the Skiff Club. The members had regular events in the swimming pool from the 1920's up to its destruction in 1974.

When the Club took over the old baths building it also inherited the ruins of the north side of the actual swimming pool. The Council was persuaded by a Club member to leave it standing because it could prove to be useful in future. That structure became the Club jetty and members repaired it and linked it back to the Clubhouse where it had been completely washed away. This work took place around 1980. Initially there was a ramp leading down into the water from the jetty for launching sailing dinghies.

A deal was struck between the Council, The Skiff Club, the Digger's Swimming Club and MYC. The deal was that the Skiff Club takes over the Diggers Swimming Club for the purpose of storing skiffs and in exchange the Skiff Club would pay an agreed sum of money to the Diggers. The Diggers would then share the Baths Building with MYC and plough the money received from the Skiff Club into converting the building into a clubhouse. The money was used to build the wide veranda overlooking the water. Originally the veranda was intended to run the whole length of the building but the money ran out.

The Diggers contributed to the décor by installing "the Eternal Flame" and crossed 303 rifles above the door. In those days firearms were not unknown to MYC which owned a couple of sawn off shotguns for starting races. The Skiff Club had guns too and when both clubs were conducting races and there was a general recall it sounded like a naval gun battle in North Harbour.

The level of sophistication enjoyed by the Club has increased over time and this is reflected in the improved circumstances of the Club headquarters. Stuart's boatshed, for example, provided boat storage, a slip and a hall on the upper floor, which could be used for dances and other social gatherings. Women and girls became involved with the Club and although the women's toilets were nothing to write home about they did boast a beautiful Victorian etched glass door bearing the words "LADIES CLOAKROOM". This door, which was scheduled for conservation, mysteriously disappeared.

Currently the Club facilities are so well appointed that it has become a popular venue for weddings.

The women were the wives, mothers and girl friends of the sailors. Their main function was as organisers of dances, social functions and catering. Initially there were no women on the Board and none of them sailed. How things have changed. With the advent of the Manly Junior girls took to the water but back then that was unusual, so when Lee Ebeling won a regatta in an MJ at Royal Brighton Yacht Club in Victoria she was not allowed into the clubhouse to receive her trophy! Men only.

Now these girls are back with a vengeance. Having taken time out to study, have a career, get married, have kids, they own and skipper their own yachts.

Now one of the main events on Sydney Harbour is the Women's Challenge. It attracts over 40 yachts from clubs everywhere, some with all female crew but every one has a female helm. It is the brain-child of Ivana Gattegno and it is run entirely by MYC.



Earlier when yachts were first admitted to the club, encouraged by the fact that some of the older 14ft skiff sailors decided a bit of comfort was in order, women became crew. Cruises were interspersed with the racing and the social side of yachting became popular.

In the boardroom and on the sailing committee things were changing as well.

There are now ten women in official positions and when Maz Theaker became Commodore she was one of the first women to occupy such a key position. At a dinner at the Sydney Amateurs Sailing Club for the most senior representatives of all the yacht clubs in the Sydney Harbour / Pittwater area few years ago, Maz Theaker (as she was then) was the only woman there in her official capacity, as Commodore. MYC is truly a family orientated club and is a leader in the field of introducing women to sailing and making them key members of the club.





## LASER STATE TITLES

On the weekend of 14-15th November Ed Wray (*Tequila*) and Garth Riley (*Cheeky*) made the trip up the M1 to Wangi Wangi on Lake Macquarie to compete in the Laser open and Masters State titles.

The forecast promised lots of wind and rain however the rain arrived but not so much of the wind.

The weekend attracted 142 entries across the 4 fleets with Ed competing in Master radials and Garth in the combined Open / Masters standard fleet.

Ed had a successful weekend with very consistent results finishing 11th out of 43 overall and 2nd in the apprentice master division.

Garth easily reached his goal of 'better than 3rd last' finishing 39th out of 52 in the overall fleet including a 21st in the last heat where he spent most of the race at the pointy end and had some bad luck towards the finish.

Both sailors took on valuable experience in big fleet racing against many current and past world champions and look ahead to the Masters Nationals coming up mid February at Port Stephens.

Several years ago the Club decided to participate in the Manly Arts Festival. The Clubhouse was set up as an Art Gallery and on display were works of Art produced by Club Members. It was an eye opener.

The variety of exhibits for one thing was astonishing, and the skill with which they had been produced was another. The list includes:- paintings, drawings, ship models, pottery, beanies, photographs, sculpture, kayaks and more. The organising committee consisted mainly of women.

The original MYC 1, the first of the yachts, was made of plywood. There is only one plywood yacht still racing with the club and it is new and hi tech, and there are only two traditional style yachts with wooden spars and a carvel hulls. The early fibreglass yachts were often bought as bare hulls and fitted out by the owners themselves. The yachts were quite small by current standards. Endeavour 26's and 24's were popular.

With bigger and more sophisticated yachts, the club became more adventurous in its sailing endeavours. The first MYC yacht to compete in the Sydney-Hobart race was *Metung* in 1957 although the Holmes brothers, who owned the yacht, regarded it as a training exercise for their planned trip around the world. Since then seven other yachts have competed in the race and in 1992 Nigel Holman in *Cuckoo's Nest* actually won it. MYC yachts have competed in virtually all the off shore races on the east coast of Australia including Airlie Beach and Hamilton Island events. Bruce Hitchman in *Pacific Breeze* competed in the Melbourne-Osaka Race and sailed back virtually single-handed.



In 2009, 13 MYC yachts entered various divisions in the Audi Sydney Harbour Regatta. And they won 3 divisional first places. The following day, six MYC members drove Audi sports

cars to the best of their ability to win the big prize, but their sailing skills proved better than their driving skills.

Club members have crewed on yachts competing in the Fastnet Race (UK), Cork Week (Ireland), the race from Manly (Queensland) to Gizo (Solomon Islands), Sydney-Hobart (many times), New Zealand and Osaka. *Metuna* sailed around the world and *Eos* made it to Hawaii.



Such is the prominent position that MYC holds in the yachting world that the club, in 2000, was invited to co-host the World Junior Sailing Championships with the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron. Club members were involved in every aspect of running the event.

The Clubhouse was the headquarters and the Club received an accolade for the 'Olympic standard' of the organisation. The Club was also involved in organising the Sydney component of the Tall Ships Race at the Bicentenary. Local yachts assembled at Jervis Bay where the Tall Ships lay at anchor and sailed back to Sydney harbour with them.



Solings were a class at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney and Solings were a popular class at MYC at the time. The club became involved in the selection trials for the Australian team. Members trained as race officers and official measurers.

The growing sophistication in yacht racing is evident in the Racing Rules of Sailing, and the boats, particularly the yachts, sport very sophisticated electronic equipment. Safety standards have improved and more safety equipment is required. All of this, means that sailing has become much more expensive. No longer can you roll up to the beach with the wooden skiff you built yourself and still be competitive. The era of the build it yourself Manly Junior or Manly Graduate has gone and the time has been filled with computers and electronic games. The sheds and garages, which provided the space to build, are now home entertainment spaces or gyms. But the enthusiasm for sailing has not diminished.



In 1998 Sailability, then known as Sailability North Sydney/Manly, became associated with Manly Yacht Club. Then a whole new burst of activity began. The concept of a floating pontoon was born which would be of great benefit to Sailability sailors, Manly Juniors and other dinghy classes. Gene Scott and Leslee Cameron battled with Maritime NSW and Manly Council to gain approval, Keith Woodward made successful grant applications for funding, and Club Members designed, built and launched the pontoon. It was a massive job for a bunch of volunteers and great credit to them for achieving such a splendid result.



Sailability has adapted the clubhouse for Sailors with Disabilities by building access-able toilets and bullying Manly Council to provide a ramped walkway from the street to the promenade and thence to the boat storage area and the deck. Sailability and MYC have been involved in National Titles and Sailability Manly can boast a National Champion.



However there were times when the Club fell on hard times. When the first great wave of Manly Junior sailors out grew their small craft, membership stalled. This coincided with Dads with less time to build boats and manufactured boats were expensive.

Sometimes it's fun to do lots of bailing.

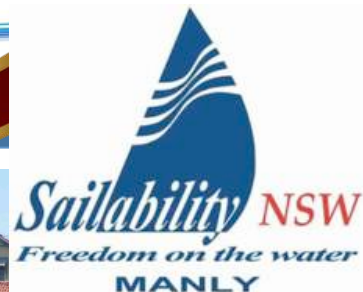
So, Barry, Mal, David, Eli,

A super day, and well worth the waiting.

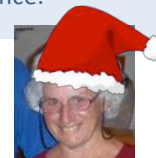
### A LETTER FROM OLLIE WILLIAMS

Other sports were being promoted, particularly through the schools, and Sailing had stiff competition. At one point, the Board members paid three years subscriptions in advance to tide the Club over. There was the situation when the Club's new rescue boat ended up on the beach in a stiff southerly. It snapped in two, when a crane was used to lift it. The salvage company appointed by the Insurance Company failed to empty the boat, which was full of sand and water, before lifting it. The Insurance Company paid up and the Club survived on the payout.

Manly Yacht Club owes much of its present standing to a succession of dynamic presidents and officers who had the energy, skill and diplomatic ability to make things happen. They steered the Club over the years from the beach to the present day. There was the decision by **Harry Pollard** and **Dave Sleeman** (Treasurer) and others to buy Stuarts Boatshed made on the run with the deposit being paid out of their own pockets. Then there was **Mike Mellows** laying it on the line to the Board and outlining the pros and cons of leasing the Baths Building. 

There was **Gene Scott**, a long term President, and a brilliant negotiator, who secured a long lease from Council. Then **Keith Woodward**, whose ability to obtain grants, resulted in much of the Club's improved facilities. Look at the Honour Board in the Clubroom to see all the names. **Bruce Davis** has been the longest standing Commodore in the Club and one of the longest standing Board Members. With his wife **Pam** they have made a major contribution to the success of the Club and fostered the close association between the Club and Davis Marina. **Carlyle**, the Club's venerable start boat, actually belongs to Bruce. 

The Sailing Committee has built up the Club's standing as a major player in the greater Sydney sailing scene. Credit must go also to the volunteers who, over the years, have built up the Club by sheer hard work. No wonder the Club won the New South Wales State Volunteers Award from the Department of Sport and Recreation in 2003.

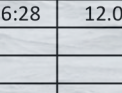

TWL 5 - ABANDONED

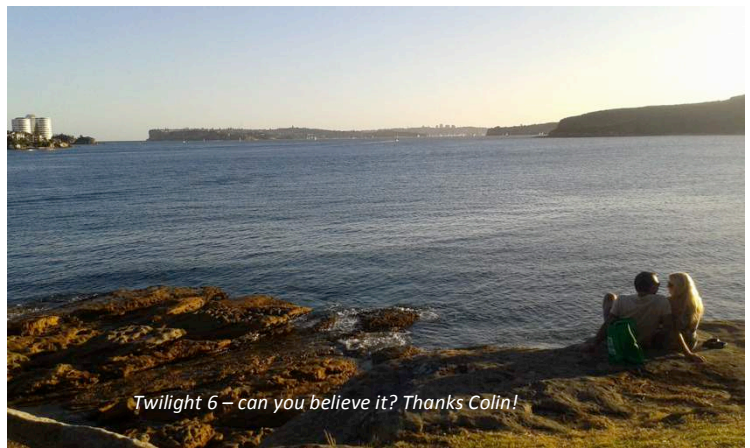

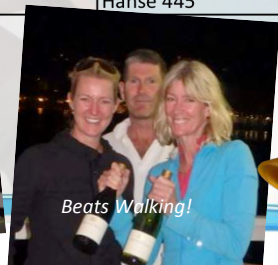

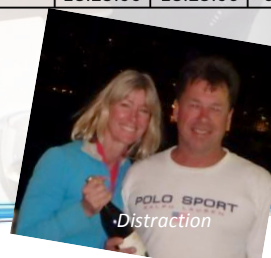
