# COMMODORE'S REPORT



As this newsletter goes to the "press", the final preparations are being made for the **Open BIC NSW State Titles** to be hosted by MYC.



While MYC has been part of State and National regattas before, it has been a long while since we took on an event of this scale

and significance. Thanks, has to go (in advance) to **David Holland**, who has made this event a reality, but also to a long list of others that have been vital to getting our junior program back to such a healthy state: **Bruce Davis** for being the driving force behind much of the junior program; **Cary Budd** and his Board for backing the investments needed in junior fleet; **Manly Sailing** for integrating their learn-to-sail and schools programs as our primary source of new sailors; **the members/friends/family** that contributed to the various fund raising efforts; and a long (and incomplete) list of **Junior parents including Greg Taranto, Jo & Mark Rees**, who while not directly involved in this event helped build the platform on which it is based.

I trust the regatta will go well and that all members from all fleets will take a keen interest in the ongoing development of the MYC junior fleet!


**For the other fleets**, the start of the season has gotten off to a great start, with some good (if challenging) sailing conditions. The twilight fleets have been very healthy and the atmosphere back at the clubhouse afterwards has been fantastic.

**The growing laser fleet and the yachts** are doing well with the sharing of our support boats and we are regularly getting off three races each Sunday. This makes for a challenging, yet interesting time for the race committee, which has been well staffed by volunteers from the fleets and beyond (but **Shane** <[dutyroster@myc.org.au](mailto:dutyroster@myc.org.au)> still has more slots to fill so keep giving him your support).



**We have had a few boat-on-boat incidents** whilst racing. While best to avoid, we can be pleased that they have all been handled very well both on and off the water, in gracious and sporting spirit. The incident reporting mechanisms appear to be working well, but it is good to remind all that incidents should be reported to the club for any damage or injury.

**There have been no formal protests**, which is both good and bad. It is well worth remembering that it is a *Basic Principles of the Racing Rules of Sailing* that all competitors are expected to follow, **AND ENFORCE**, the rules. Thus if a breach of the rules is observed by a competitor, it is not sufficient to have a quiet word to the race committee. If you think a rule has been breached, you are expected to protest as nobody else can do so on your behalf. It's part of the sport!

# HISTORY – THE COMMODORE’S BELL



In 1994 the then Commodore Bruce Davis presented the Club with a bell. Its main purpose was to gain the attention of the unruly crowd on the club balcony when it was time to present the awards after a race. It was hand held when the bell was tolled and just laid on a table when not in use. This was considered to be unsatisfactory and lacking in the dignity required for such occasions.

It just so happened that the doors of the famous Hotel Manly, located at the junction of West Esplanade and Belgrave Street, had closed for the last time a few years earlier in 1989. The residential accommodation had been sealed off for some time because it could not comply with the fire regulations. Its replacement, The Grand Esplanade, was completed in 1996 and it incorporated the statue of Captain Phillip, which had adorned the old Hotel. Captain Phillip famously landed in Manly in 1788 and was responsible for giving Manly its name.

Incidentally the plinth at the corner of West Esplanade and Belgrave Street, which features the plaque commemorating Captain Phillip, incorporates bricks from the ruins of his house, which were shipped out from England.

The old hotel was a building of architectural significance, although some would question its beauty. It featured in Manly’s schedule of historic buildings. Designed by famous architect Emil Sodertsen in the Art Deco style in 1924, it had a seven-storey extension added in 1935. It was the epitome of a modern hotel, high-rise; with a majestic ballroom; dining room and bar. The joinery in the principal rooms was made from Australian red cedar.

Now Brian Wilson, who has an eye for a nice piece of timber, managed to gain access to the hotel site during the demolition process and secured several pieces of the Australian red cedar.

He used that timber, from the famous Hotel Manly, to make the stand for the Commodore’s Bell.

Note: Emil Sodersten also designed the War Memorial in Canberra. He died in Manly in 1961.

## WHAT WE WERE UP TO IN OCTOBER

### WORKING BEE DAY DUE TO BAD WEATHER

We were forced to cancel our regular sailing day because of the gale force winds, which were not only forecast, but were actually happening on the water while a small group of us went into our relatively sheltered area to complete some of the tasks that have been mounting up over a number of months.



We formed 2 teams....

The cleaning team ... Marcos, Helen and Eli ... who washed and mended lifejackets, pillows, etc, and checked for damage beyond repair.

Barry, and the 2 Davids had a much bigger job: 2 masts needed a small repair, and 2 furling systems were ready for replacement.

This demanded boats being balanced on a lifejacket stand, so that they could be worked on upside down, and work with a very slow hardening fibreglass mixture to attach the furlers.



Fiddly jobs that needed doing and today was the perfect day for it.

### SAILING DAYS - Wonderful Wednesdays

The morning started with a little more breeze than we are used to, but it wasn't long before it settled down to its forecast 6 to 8 knots, which is absolutely ideal for our purposes.

Our key story is Ben (from Fisher Rd) who decided to take the huge step of sailing solo, with a couple of modifications to the boat handling equipment to make it easier for his hands to manage the controls. Under the supervision of helper, Kel, and our training instructor, David, he was settled in *Clea*, towed out to the clear water, given a couple of final instructions... and he was off, free on the water.

What a smile, the mouth is stretching from ear to ear, and those hands are doing all the work. After an hour or so, he glides back up to the pontoon under his own steam with a thousand thanks to the volunteers, and after being lifted out into his wheelchair, he is back up the ramp with promises to be back next time.

Next Time ... Ben from Royal Rehab came down with his O.T., Lisa.

On only his 3<sup>rd</sup> solo sailing, it was quite amazing to see Ben confidently steering using the joy-stick, then swapping hands for a moment while he adjusted the sails, then re-grabbed the joy-stick to turn around the buoy to come back to the pontoon, all the while managing that swap over for the 30 minutes or so it took him to sail back home again. A wonderful experience for Ben, as well as for everyone watching.

## A TRIP ON TENACIOUS



*Tenacious* is a wooden Tall Ship, built in the UK by many thousands of people, both with a disability and able-bodied.

She took more than 4 years to complete, and was launched in April 2000. Since then she has been sailing the high seas with different crews, both able-bodied and people with a disability, from different ports around the world. At the moment she is sailing around the south coast of Australia, between Melbourne, and Adelaide ports. She will be back in Sydney late in December, then again in February/March, 2017.

While in Sydney, she sits at the Australian National Maritime Museum at Darling Harbour. *Tenacious* is totally accessible, and can be sailed by both able-bodied people, and people with a disability.

**Sailability NSW** will be chartering *Tenacious* on **Sunday, 5<sup>th</sup> March 2017** for a day trip outside of Sydney Harbour, on the wide blue sea.

This will be a fantastic experience for the first 43 people who get their names in to me and money into the account.

We have an **Early Bird Special** for those who book before **30<sup>th</sup> November** of \$240.00.
