Dear Members,

I was encouraged by the positive feedback regarding the recent changes to the twilight dinner approach.

I am frustrated by the more challenging weather conditions for our twilight races this season resulting in fewer opportunities for a pleasant evening sail to cap off the week. Come on Huey; help us out.

I was humbled by the hundreds of volunteered hours from the small group of passionate MYC members, who assembled the BIC boat-storage boxes, which are now in use. This will help meet the increasing demand for more boat and storage space. As sailing clubs go, a good problem to have.

I was proud to endorse, with your Board, a couple of collaborative sailing events with the 16FT Skiff Club in 2018 including the Flying 11 National Titles during the third week in January.

I was repetitive in my lobbying for more boat storage space by expanding our club lease footprint with NBC officers, during a recent Community Forum and in response to the NBC invitation for feedback on their proposed East Esplanade upgrade.

I am pleased to announce our new events intern (Anne-Laure Deliere) who is volunteering 200 hours to learn from us and to also contribute to the planning and implementation of some of our key social and racing events - including the Women's Challenge and our Summer and Winter Balls. Also RSA qualified, she will be behind the bar for twilights from late January so can meet lots of members. If you have any inkling to join the Board as Events Director but thought it may be overwhelming, with Anne-Laure helping us, now is the time to do it.

I am glad to see our MJ back in our foyer after its visit to the Manly Art Museum across the bay. I hope you had the chance to see it in the exhibition. Thank you to the Ebeling family for their contribution.

I am hush-hush about the naming of our (newish) support boat. Found by David Lewis and restored for a new working life by the talents of Bruce Davis. The announcement will be at the Commodore's Picnic this Sunday.

I'm one of many appreciative of the ongoing commitment of our Club Captain, Colin Cameron, who has continued hands-on deck and club storage management and maintenance.

He recently arranged the replacement of three pylons at the head of our jetty as part of our maintenance plan... one investment with a long-term return.

I am happy to see a constant trickle of new membership applications come through reflecting ongoing recruitment by skippers to our club and a conversion of newbies attracted to our community culture and our broad spectrum of sailing opportunities.

I am puzzled how the new container deposit legislation may impact our club. Indications are very little. I hope it achieves the reduction in litter it was designed to address.

I am thankful for the often above-the-call-of duty shown by Barry Mifflin, our Club Manager, as he finds creative and usually low-cost ways the keep things running smoothly.

I am relieved to see the positive returns from our hall hiring during this peak wedding season due to Sorrell's marketing efforts... back from the dark and frustrating days last year as we recovered from the fire.

I am concerned that there is either a cultural shift towards volunteering, perhaps even generational; as our club struggles to fill much needed race committee positions and other essential roles in our club. I am convinced we can find a way you can contribute your talents and skills and have fun while doing so. A couple of urgent positions include editor for this newsletter, race officers, and management roles across the organisation.

# COMMODORE'S REPORT

Hello, you excellent people!

I hope that you've all been enjoying some great sailing out on the water. Having personally sailed in a few parts of the world, including the Solent, the so-called Sailing Mecca on England's South Coast, I think I can state with some authority that we are truly blessed to have the simply superb Sydney Harbour on our doorstep.

For four years Gerry has taught a 16-hour "Weather for Sailors" course at the University of Sydney's Centre for Continuing Education.

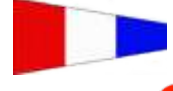
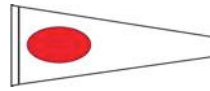


## The Club Spirit and Volunteering

## Mandatory Race Officer Training

We have a critical shortage of people putting up their hands and volunteering to be Race Officers (ROs), i.e. be the starter rather than an assistant to the starter. As a result, we have come very, very close to having to cancel races at the last minute.

You may or may not be aware, but there is extensive support in place for each RO, including the availability of Club Principal Race Officer Stephen Teudt as well as Club Handicapper Graham Radford and Fleet Captains Richard Lacey, Michael Rowe and David Wright, all of whom would be available via mobile phone to give advice as to course selection, race postponements or abandonments, dealing with incidents and whatever else arises.

Accordingly, Stephen Teudt has designed and will run some RO training to give our members (who haven't already done a RO course) the guidance and confidence to select the yacht and laser courses appropriate to the weather, drive the club committee boat (Carlyle), manage the assistants and mark boat (Robbie R), start (and finish) the yacht and laser races and manage any emergency situations.

Also, starting and finishing Yachts and Lasers is really not all that different: it is the same procedure that we use, just that the Laser races are a little shorter.



So I think all Yachties and Laser sailors owe a huge thank you to those who have already volunteered, particularly those who saved our bacon by stepping in at very, very short notice to assist.

For those that have yet to volunteer, Members tell us that they are happy to be assistants but that they are unsure how to be an RO.



Nevertheless, we have no choice but to urgently address the shortage of RO volunteers if we wish to run a full race program.



## Mandatory Race Officer Training, continued



In an all-volunteer club, none of us wants to make race duty or RO training compulsory! We shouldn't have to flog people to find volunteers! But our pleas for more volunteers have not yielded enough people to run the race program. Which makes those people who do volunteer all the more precious, so again a big thank you to those who do volunteer!

**So, rightly or wrongly, we have decided to make it mandatory for each yacht to provide one person for RO training because otherwise we can't continue to run a full race program.** As your Commodore, Muir Watson has donned his tin hat and flak jacket and looks forward to receiving your feedback on this decision ([commodore@myc.org.au](mailto:commodore@myc.org.au)).

**There will also be stronger enforcement of duty boat concept: all yachts will be allocated a duty day and must provide all positions** except for the one person that will be provided by the laser fleet plus anyone else who has volunteered for that day, such as some of our much-appreciated regulars. Usually we need six people for a committee boat start/finish, including operating Robbie R as a mark boat. Yachts with smaller crew sizes will be paired with another similarly-sized boat and asked to, between the two crews, provide enough people to fill the race committee positions.



**Remember, the duty boat for each event is published on the MYC website and it is the responsibility of each skipper to check when they are on duty.** You can swap dates with another boat if you wish, but it is up to you to organise the replacement directly with the other skipper.



So, if you haven't already done an RO course before, would you be willing to help us out by coming along to the RO training and perhaps encouraging a few other members to come too? **Please contact Stephen on [pro@myc.org.au](mailto:pro@myc.org.au) to find out when the next RO training is scheduled.**

Also, if you haven't already volunteered to assist at a race day, why not volunteer now on a day that suits you best, before we allocate you a day that may not be as convenient? **Please follow the links from the [www.myc.org.au](http://www.myc.org.au) home page to the Roster RC/RSA tab** (see the blue menu on the top left hand side of the page), which opens a google drive spreadsheet in which you can directly select a date and race committee position. Alternatively, you can contact Shane Kelly on [dutyroster@myc.org.au](mailto:dutyroster@myc.org.au) to organise a suitable day to volunteer.

Many hands make light work and it is only fair that we spread race day duties over more of our members. As it happens, the feedback from those who do occasionally volunteer is that Race Committees are far more fun than they expected. So, not only do you gain the warm glow that comes from having helped out your Club by volunteering your time, you will have fun doing it!

So, please, volunteer today! Remember, **an all-volunteer club needs volunteers!**

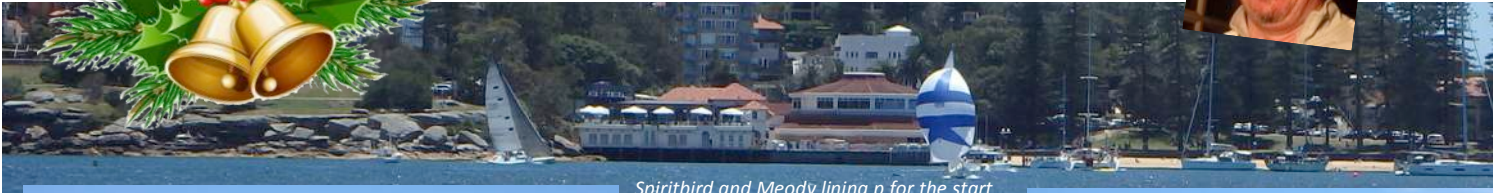

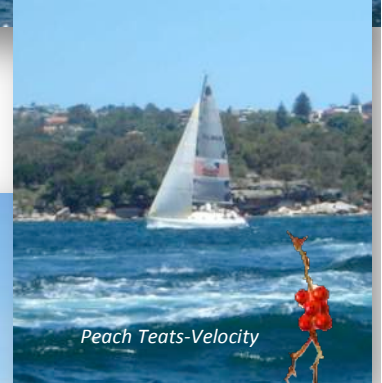

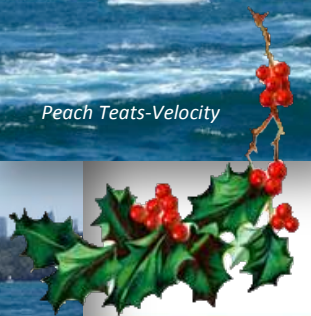

### ROYAL PRINCE EDWARD YACHT CLUB

Unfortunately the **MYC Mini Regatta** clashed with the **J24 State Titles** this year but weather wise it wasn't really desirable to be at either with showers, grey skies and even cold pretty much all weekend.

MYC was represented by **Kaotic** (Arthur Crothers / helm Sean Kirkjan), **Ace** (new MYC member Dave West) and **Wildfire** (Janette Syme / Robert Richardson).

13 boats competed this year with only one interstate boat **Bruschetta** (Hugo Ottway) from Sandringham Victoria. Brendan Lee also from Sandringham, helmed Sydney boat **Waterbourne Again** with crew from Sydney. There had been promised more, though the fleet was pretty star studded and tight and to place in the top 10 was hard going let alone top 5!

The wind was kind to us ranging 8-12knots S/SE/E all weekend and because of the rainy conditions the harbour was relatively clear of pleasure craft, which is always a help.

Royal Prince Edward Yacht Club hosted the series therefore the racing was predominantly across the harbour channel in the vicinity of Taylor's Bay to Chowder Bay; across to Shark Island area up to Watson Bay.

Six races were scheduled and raced, though heat 5 was abandoned (we were running to the finish line in clear 2nd place-bum!)

Altogether a clean and hard fought series and as usual the standout performer was **Kaotic** with 4 from 5 wins.

**Ace**, with solid consistent sailing, finished second overall. Dave West and crew have been pushing the leader board for many years so thoroughly deserved their podium position.

Steve Girdis in **Convicts Revenge** (past NSW and National Champion) was third. First Cronulla boat was **Stockar** helmed by the one and only Dave Mackay (has been dining out on winning the Moth Worlds x 2 for years).

**Bruschetta** - Hugo Ottway (multiple State and National Champion) was 5th. New to the class is Steve Wright (current Jubilee Champion) an exciting competitor and has recently imported a German J24 - he was placed 6th.

7th was John Crawford sailing **Innaminka** from MHYC - he has snared many podium finishes in the State and National titles over the years.

8th was **Wildfire** (Janette and Rob and Matt Miles on the bow is also an MYC member) - have no credentials as yet but keep trying!

We had our usual moments of brilliance i.e. 1st to 1st mark of 1st leg of 1st race - finished 4th after being swamped on the finish line! But our moments are increasing hopefully exponentially.

We have the National Titles in January at Sandringham Victoria and will be taking all three crews down (though Arthur will have a different helm Shane Guarana) to represent MYC.

So well done to the MYC competitors especially Arthur and his merry men - just too good again!

Hopefully we can get a few boats to the mini regatta next year and of course best of luck to our fabulous boats and crew at the Nationals.
