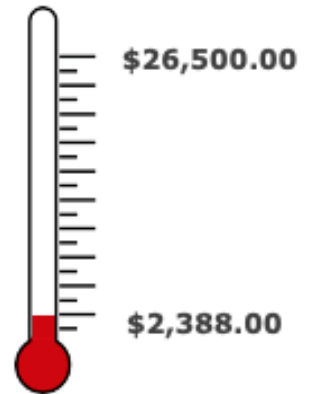

RADIO TRAINING DATES IN JUNE

Sailability Manly has used a very generous grant from Northern Beaches Council to purchase VHF handheld radios for every Hansa 303 boat in our fleet. With the help of these small radios, skippers of each boat can be in contact with the MYC deck radio and also with the safety crew on Charlie's Chariot. In summary, skippers will be able to hear:

- Happenings / updates on other boats;
- Which boat is being sent back to the pontoon to pick up a new participant;
- Signals to return to the pontoon for any other reason, i.e. heavy weather approaching, Marine Rescue Helicopter drills, participants waiting on shore, etc.

We cannot stress strongly enough that these radios will be a benefit to the safety of our skippers, participants and to the group as a whole. From the boat, skippers will also be able to request help with the participant in your boat, request a tow from Charlie's Chariot or any other assistance that may be required while sailing out in Manly Cove. Having access to a radio in every boat will make our operation safer, more efficient and easier for our entire team.

- To facilitate matters, John W is going to help us all to learn to use the radios, first of all on shore, and then in the boats while sailing. These training dates are: Saturday, 12th June for Saturday helpers, and
- Wednesday, 16th June for Monday and Wednesday helpers.

If you are both, you may come twice, for a double dose, or choose the date you prefer. Bookings for Groups on these dates will not go ahead. Use of the radios on boats will be optional, but we do expect all volunteers to attend the training and learn to use the radios.

On to more local news: Tuesday to Thursday 20-23 April, Sailability Manly benefitted by the installation of a new storage cupboard! Thanks to the ingenuity of **David Goldner** and **David Webb**, we now have a magnificent and energy efficient storage cupboard. These storage units save time and energy, because now all of our gear can be moved outside on Sailing days with a minimum of entries and exits to Manly Yacht Club by volunteers.

This cupboard was the last project to be completed, and it was a huge effort for only a handful of people who made the time to pull out the old storage units (to be repurposed) and replace with cupboards that we can really use. The construction includes a safe ladder that can be hooked over the railing to give full access to shelving that even tiny Eli can access.

This addition provides us with a large amount of space to store all of our equipment and the tools to keep everything maintained. The photos don't do it justice; inside is amazing!

Moving and reorganising our equipment will be slow, careful, logical, and ethical and take a few more days of deliberation. In the meantime, the floor has been vacuumed and all looks spacious and comforting!

(Phyllopteryx taeniolatus)

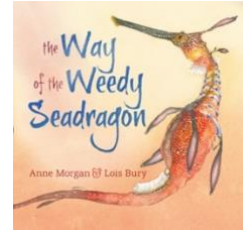

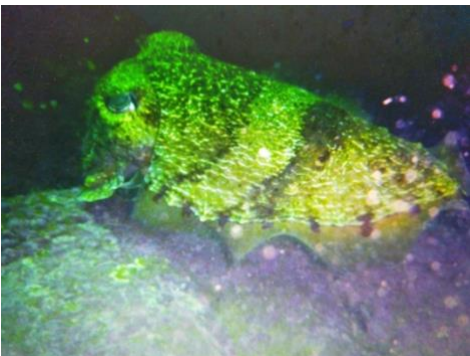

Greetings from the Dragon Boaters

As a member of both MYC and the Northern Beaches Dragon Boat Club, I thought I would tell you something we did recently that lines up with MYC's environmental push.

Following a recent Facebook post from the Manly Observer asking people to help clean up our beaches, we paddlers decided to get in on the act. Our idea was that we could pull up on a beach that was inaccessible by car and see what was there. We chose both **Store** and **Reef** Beaches.



However, when the 18 of us eventually pulled up and looked closely we found all sorts of non-degrading debris caught up in both the tide lines and further up from the water line in the surrounding bush.

There were lots of little plastic pieces like miniature soy bottles, broken off pieces of plastic and glass, the odd tennis ball and a few "disposable" food containers. Thankfully there were only a few drink containers, but the worst and most difficult to retrieve was the degrading polystyrene packaging and cups which broke down to thousands of little white balls.

In all we collected about a quarter of a red topped bin of rubbish, quite a haul considering how small the individual pieces were.

Most of you won't have seen us as we train at least every Sunday, the same day as you race, but we are generally gone by 10:15am well before you come down to rig up.

There are over 60 of us aging from early 20's to mid 70's and, like sailing, it can become mildly addictive.
