## COMMODORE'S REPORT

#### **CCSS**

The first Combined Clubs Sunday Series race has been successfully completed.

MHYC and MYC combined race management managed to run a fleet of 27 boats (including lasers) on the day. We had competitors from MYC, MHYC and the CYCA on the day.

The weather was a bit frustrating because of light winds and the racing had to be shortened. But this new cooperation between clubs has demonstrated how we can grow our fleets/divisions to make for more competitive/fun sailing.

The next CCSS race will be a Sprint Series. MHYC will run this with assistance from MYC. It forms part of the MYC Sprint Series as well.

A reminder that if you enter into the MYC Club Championship you have free entry into the MYC Sprint Series and the CCSS.

#### **MARATHON**

The Marathon race was a success with 10 boats racing in two divisions. Nearly everyone finished. One boat retired due to a mark rounding error and another sailed into Middle Harbour looking for wind and never came out again. Guess there was even less wind in Middle Harbour.

As a lot of our future sailing will now be starting and finishing in The Sound, it has become obvious that our existing marks are too small. They cannot be seen from a distance in a swell. The Board has approved the purchase of new larger inflatable marks, some of which have arrived.

A special mention to club member Claire Rowlands for her very generous donation which paid for the buoys.

9 October from 6pm

Wednesday Led by National Safety Equipment Auditor and RYA Yachtmaster Instructor, Phil Darling, this session covers MHYC's risk management framework, harbour hazards, dealing with groundings, vessel and crew preparation, and MOB retrieval along with an open forum to discuss participants areas of interest.

#### Flags & Signals

Wednesday Ever wondered what all those confusing flags mean!

23 October

from 6pm This is useful information for sailors competing at MHYC and other clubs, and important for volunteers wanting to build their knowledge of race management. This session also constitutes Part 1 of the MHYC Race Officer Course.

### **TWILIGHT** TIPS & **TRICKS**



- Check the Official Noticeboard for any alterations to the Notice of Race (NOR) or Sailing Instructions (SI)
  - https://www.myc.org.au/notice-board/
- Check the time against the website clock (top left hand side of www.myc.org.au (remember to refresh the screen if it's been opened for some time)
- Check the predicted wind direction and strength
- Check what the tide is doing. It might just influence your tactics
- Check for local shipping passenger ships love departing about the time we race
- Read the General Conditions of Racing (GCR) in conjunction with the NOR & SI, taking note of GCR 7.8.4 relating to ferries and shipping.

#### And... just a few reminders...

**DON'T** - Enter the zone early

**DON'T** - do practise starts

**DON'T** - interfering with boats starting

**DON'T** - leave your anchor on the bow roller

**DON'T** - finish in the ferry lane

The first marathon of the new season saw 10 boats in 2 divisions take off down the harbour on the shorter course 4 as the weather continued its unpredictability for another week.


Sunshine, wind, no wind, cloudy and some spots of rain, this race had marathon written all over it.

The first boat, *Solace* (division 2) started at 11:30; the last boat to start was *Kanreki* (division 1) at 11:54 and the last boat to finish came home at 16:11. It was quite a long day for the race committee. Thank you commodore Stephen, Graeme, Geoff, Dmitry, Phil and Bobby. Your dedication is appreciated.

Fastest around the course in division 1, with a skeleton crew, was *Kanreki* who also placed first on handicap, next came *Absolut* over the line followed by *Esprit* (also a skeleton crew) then *San Toy*; *Solace* DNF'd due to a mark passing error. On corrected time *Absolut* placed second with *San Toy* in third spot and the starters prize 0 seconds.

In division 2 *Cheap Thrills* finished ahead of *Plum Crazy* with *Magician V* taking third place across the line. The handicaps didn't change the final order. *Shear Magic* had a wardrobe malfunction when a shackle inside the spinnaker sock let go, which may have contributed to their placing. *Stock Car*, chasing the "breeze" into Middle Harbour failed to finish unfortunately.


The buzz on the deck was palpable with twilight friends meeting up again. Lots of new faces on the deck as well being welcomed into our sailing community.


Thanks Karrie, Danielle and Riley in the galley and Brie on the bar. Looks like this will be a great sailing season!

A PARALYMPIAN IN THE FAMILY



We were excited to learn that Paralympic swimmer, Holly Warn, is the granddaughter of one our volunteers, Michael Morgan.

15-year-old Holly was Australia's youngest athlete at the Paris Paralympics and her journey there has been marked by determination and resilience. Born with cerebral palsy, doctors warned she might never walk or talk, but Holly defied the odds and began swimming at just a few months old.

She first gained attention as the youngest swimmer to trial for the Paralympics at age 12. Although she didn't make the Tokyo 2020 Games, she continued to train and compete at national levels. In 2023, she was selected for the Para Flippers Development Squad and competed in the Para Swimming European Open Championships.

At the 2024 Paris Paralympics, Holly competed in three events, and placed 7th in the 400m freestyle. With her eyes set on future Paralympic Games in Los Angeles 2028 and Brisbane 2032, Holly Warn is undoubtedly a name to watch, and we know that Michael is a very proud Grandpa indeed.




