

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Firstly, it's my pleasure to announce that Michael Rowe has stepped into the role of Vice-President (or as he want to be known as 'VEEP'). He's been an asset to the Board since joining in 2018 and I personally am looking forward to working closely with him on land and being his archrival on the water.

It's been a busy two months at the club preparing for the start of the new sailing season and the Board has approved a number of plans to invest in the club, its sailing activities and our members. Here's a list of initiatives that have been approved and are underway:

- ➤ A total budget of \$30,000 has been set aside for improvement projects over the next 12 months. The first of these projects are:
 - o A MYC Logo/brand refresh
 - A new MYC website
 - Office refurbishment (Re-orientation, paint, new carpet (donated), furniture)
- We have sold our 8 very old PJs to Vaucluse Amateur 12 Foot Sailing Club, who sail a current fleet of PJs, for \$8. One of the few clubs left of Sydney Harbour to sail PJs. They have thanked the club for helping to support their junior program.
- ➤ A Consortium of members, who wish to remain anonymous, has purchased 9 Small Rig Open Skiffs for the Junior Sailing Program to lease. This replaces the role of the PJs in our Junior Sailing Program and better prepares our kids for Open Skiffs (BIC's). You will see a number of fundraising events this year to raise funds for the club to purchase these boats from the Consortium over the next 3 years.
- ➤ Enhancing our Twilight experience we have listened to your feedback from last year and you'll notice a number of improvements to make the Twilight experience even better. Gone are plastic plates and in are white dinner plates, steak knives, extra staff, more food at the ready and an improved deck layout.
- We've order a new replacement RIB as Christabel seems have deteriorated beyond repair. We have Highfield CL310 Hypalon coming in October / November.
- Purchase of new motor for Nigel H.
- ➤ We are adding more social events to the calendar this year watch this space.
- 2019 Discover Sailing Day 27th October 2019
- Manly Yacht Club has registered with Australian Sporting Foundation to launch a program to fundraise for the Juniors and allow members to make donations that are tax-deductible.

- We have been approved for the Active Kids Voucher Program so that parents can use a \$100 voucher (discount) for our junior program and the NSW Government will reimburse the club.
- ➤ The Board approved a Membership Strategy to improve the new member experience, increase participation, retention of members and attract new members to the club. Over the coming months you will see a number of initiatives announced under this strategy.
- Crew Management Platform we've listened to your feedback that it's difficult to find crew and also crewing opportunities within MYC. So we will be adopting MySailTeam, which is a platform that helps members find crewing positions, connecting you with skippers and manages your sailing schedule. For yacht owners: connect with new sailors, manage your sailing crew and easily communicate with your crew. Currently yachts are using a variety of different methods to manage and communicate with crew and we will encourage all our skippers and members to use the same platform so you have access to all our members.
- We've added three new honorary members (non-sailing volunteers) who will be regularly assisting on our Race Committee. The club welcomes

 - o Hannah Morse and
 - Miguel Ferreiro and thanks them for their commitment to the club.

As the largest fleet racing at Manly Yacht Club it is essential that we get some volunteers to step up and help out as Race Committee. This is no longer optional but a requirement under the new Sailing Instructions and you will be penalised heavily for not complying. As a boat you can do this in several ways...

- Pick a race when you and your crew are the whole race committee. You can do this early when you know half your crew are on holidays or your boat is on the slip etc.
- Organise a pool with other boats that can spare 1 crew and fill the volunteer positions over a few weeks.
- Or, do what I do ... sell the experience of volunteering. Free Wine and Dinner to non-sailing family members to fill the positions and still go Sailing. If you have nonsailing friends and family, they can still be part of this great club and Friday Nights at the Club is one of the best views in Sydney. YOU'RE THE SKIPPER

YOU'RE RESPONSIBLE!

SAFETY

As a skipper you are responsible that your boat; crew and equipment are up to scratch. This includes nav lights, PFDs etc. Please make sure we finish the season with all our crew and boats in good condition and without incident.

If the weather if is out of your comfort range, please err on the conservative side and relax at the club instead. It's not worth risking your crew, your boat and others in the race for whatever reason.

I also highly recommend carrying a hand held VHF and keeping it near the helm. They are very inexpensive; a great safety tool; as well as being in contact with the race committee, the rest of the fleet, and the support boats.

Also this year there has been some changes to the sailing instructions. In some races the finish line may be moved and you can ask the RC for clarification. This is allowed under the sailing instructions and is not treated as outside assistance.

Read the Handbook for changes in guidelines, rules, SIs and courses.

Note the dates and rules for the Twilight Female Helm Series. Enter this series separately from the twilights. Handicaps and Results for the Female Helm Series are processed separately and on different scoring method from the Twilight Series.

FINISHING

At the start and finish of the twilight series the days are short and recording finishing times is a bit challenging.

- Please light up your sail number with a bright torch.
- ✓ Record your own finishing time in case we missed you.
- ✓ Radio the club on channel 72 (on your handheld VHF) and tell them your sail number and you are finishing. You may or may not get a reply.
- Take note of the boat in front and behind you.

The start/finish line can be deceiving whilst on the boat; obstructed with boats on anchor, ferries etc. It is good practice if possible to look at the start line from the clubhouse and get reference to these obstructions.




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PRICE BULLET 9006 FOR SALE

Denis, Michael, Warwick, Judith and Natalie drove up either on Friday or Saturday to take part in the sailing at Port Macquarie, as well as more formal conference procedures.

Friday evening we met Kylie Forth for the first time, a most articulate and exciting personality with incredible communication skills, as well as sailing skills, which we found out the next day. Kylie is completely blind, and has one leg. She is the captain of the current World Sailing Team, and readying her team for the next Blind Sailing Titles to take place in Canada in September.



Our own Judith, also was a shining light on Saturday, showing off her sailing skills in the servo, Alan Wood, where she was having fun fighting tide, river flow and westerly wind, then sailing blithely back, only to do it all again.

The conference was not only for fun, however, and there were sessions on issues within the branches, training in skills needed to sail as well as the skills needed to run our sailing days. Also lots of time spent in discussing the use of Regattas to encourage our sailors, and Training to Sail Better.

So... if it doesn't look like this please wash it by hand.





Peach Teats-Velocity first in 2019 CYCA / Concierge Traveller Spring Series Div 2

Peach Teats-Velocity represented Manly Yacht Club in the 2019 CYCA / Concierge Traveller Spring Series and took first place in Division 2 in a closely-fought contest which went down to the wire in the final race on 1 September. Competing in the series was a trip down memory lane for me as I had first raced on Peach Teats-Velocity crewing for previous owner Brian Carrick in the 2017 CYCA Spring Series, and for this year's series Brian was on the CYCA Committee Boat!

RACE 1 was held in chilly conditions with a 15-20 knot gusty south-westerly. We managed a wineglass in our spinnaker and a third place after *Rapid Transit* a Gp26 helmed by Beth Abbott, which reported achieving speeds of over 16 knots under spinnaker, and Craig Murray-Walker's First 30, *Oscar*.

RACE 2 brought a wilder and windier 20-25 knot north-easterly together with various spinnaker wipeouts. We flew a kite in the first downwind run but opted for a poled-out headsail for the final downwind leg. Approaching Shark Island, Sean Rahilly's Div 1 Sydney 36 Crosshaven overtook us only to chinese gybe in spectacular fashion right in front of us, ending up on her side with spinnaker in the water. Then we saw a crewmember in the water who appeared to be in trouble. If there is one thing that Manly Yacht Club emphasises, it's that you stop to help. We stopped, pulled down the pole and headed back to the MOB, arriving at much the same time as Crosshaven and staying to make sure his mates had got hold of him and were hauling him back on board.



Sean later thanked us for stopping; the MOB had been hit in the head by the boom and blacked out, coming to in the water. We finished second on handicap and in the hearing to consider our request for redress the Protest Committee commended *Peach Teats-Velocity* and awarded us equal first place with John Hewitt and Chris Johnson's S80, *Sea Ya*.

We came fourth in Race 3, a reaching race in a south-easterly breeze with gusts up to 23 knots. Going in to Race 4, there was only two points separating the top four boats and the forecast was for light conditions. It turned into the perfect day, sunny with a 10-15 knot north-easterly, just right for our masthead spinnaker.

On the final spinnaker run to the finish line, as Phil King's *Salona*, racing in Div 3, tried to go over us, one of their crew yelled out, "So what are Peach Teats, anyway?" I called back, "If you had a dairy farm you'd know. They are the best-selling teats for feeding calves on dairy farms!" and just then we got a nice gust and pulled ahead.

Although beaten by Beth Abbott in *Rapid Transit* in the race, we finished the series after one drop on 7 points, one point clear of *Rapid Transit*, with *Oscar*, also on 8 points, edged in to third place on countback, and *Sea Ya* coming in fourth with 10 points.

It was a fun, friendly and well-organised series, which we all enjoyed.

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
