It's been a busy month at Manly Yacht Club and I'm excited to share some highlights.



First up – a huge thank you to all who attended our Race Officer Training and the Skippers Briefing. Both were a great success, with strong turnouts and some valuable learnings shared. The RO training had 16 keen participants – a great sign for the season ahead.

Our grant application for critical maintenance for the wharf was successful and we received a massive **\$400,000 GRANT.** That's a huge win for the club's future. On top of that, a very large and generous donation made on behalf of *Copernicus* has funded a brand-new camera for Twilights start line, which is already on order and will be installed by







Congratulations are also in order – Bruce Davis has been named a finalist for the **LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD** at the 2025 Australian Sailing NSW Awards, and the **HELLY HANSEN WOMEN'S CHALLENGE** has been nominated for the SheSails Award. What a fantastic recognition of the work happening at MYC!

We are making progress on our **2030 MYC STRATEGY** – with our first round of Board feedback completed, once the Board has made further adjustments we will share with all committee members and the final feedback will be sought from all members.

On the operations side, the club is ticking along nicely. With new "No Diving" signage installed, we're ready for the start of the sailing season; Race Committee and RSA rosters are complete. Work is progressing on the crane and wharf projects thanks to those big grants.

Membership renewals will be sent out in mid-September. Our membership fees have not changed thanks to the increase in new members last year, so, keep an eye out for your invoice and please pay promptly.

Juniors are back in action with around 25 kids expected each weekend. Planning for the Manly Cup is underway, and it will double as a warm-up for Nationals which we are hosting in January 2026.

It'll be great to get back on the water and welcome the warmer weather.

COMMODORE'S REPORT

This season the Sailing Committee has a project to be better prepared and less reactive.

As a result, you may have noticed a campaign by the Race Directors to get skippers to sign up to our various series in the upcoming season. Expect more of this, as we believe that good communication is essential to have a great year of sailing.

The ILCA's have already started and the first race of the season for the yachts is on 21 September - a Club Championship/CCSS race. That is only two weeks away.

Many yachts at MYC have made the effort to be prepared by getting their Cat 7 Audit certificates, Attending the mandatory safety briefing and submitting their compliance documentation so they can enter.

MYC doesn't insist on compliance because we like rules. Sailing (like many sports) does carry some inherent risk. In the last 12 months there have been three tragic deaths in our sport. Two in the Hobart Race and one in twilight race. If you are just doing twilight racing don't assume it is risk free. This is why MYC (and all the other clubs) have compliance programs. To help minimise risk so we can all feel more confident that we are prepared so we get out there and enjoy ourselves.

FUNDRAISING SUCCESS

No celebration is complete without a bit of fun and generosity, and the silent auction certainly delivered. Thanks to the incredible support of members and local businesses who donated prizes, the auction raised over \$14,000. This is an outstanding result and will help MYC continue to invest in facilities, programs, and initiatives that benefit all members.

WELCOMING THE SALTWATER VETERANS

One of the night's most meaningful moments was the announcement that MYC will officially become a home for the Saltwater Veterans, a not-for-profit group that supports current and former members of the Australian Defence Force through sailing and saltwater activities. Founded by Jen and Scott, the Salties create opportunities for veterans and their families to connect, heal, and grow. Their values of camaraderie, belonging, and purpose align perfectly with our own.

This partnership builds on the strong connection forged during last season's ANZAC Commemorative Sail, when more than 100 people came together at MYC for a service and day on the harbour. From now on, MYC is proud to call the Saltwater Veterans part of our community.

HONOURING EXTRAORDINARY SERVICE

The pinnacle of the evening was the awarding of Honorary Life Membership, the highest honour that MYC can bestow. In our 75-year history, only 30 members have ever received this recognition. At the Ball, that number rose to 32 with the induction of Graham Radford and Stephen Teudt.

GRAHAM RADFORD - A LEGACY OF DESIGN AND DEDICATION

Graham Radford joined MYC in December 2000 and for nearly 25 years has been one of the club's most dedicated contributors. Known affectionately as the "Tsar of Boat Storage", Graham has applied his design and engineering brilliance to countless projects. From the construction and reconfiguration of storage areas to infrastructure upgrades, his fingerprints are on almost every major project undertaken in the last two and a half decades.

But Graham's contributions extend well beyond his technical expertise. For nearly 20 years he served as our principal handicapper, a role that demands deep knowledge of yacht performance, fairness, and – at times – a thick skin in the face of skipper complaints. He handled it all with quiet determination and commitment to the integrity of racing.

Graham has also been a tireless committee member, always ready to offer his time and skill to solve problems and strengthen the club. His generosity reached new heights last year when he and his wife made the largest philanthropic contribution MYC has ever received – the gift of our new start boat, Ready Get Set. Designed by Graham himself, this vessel is tailor-made for MYC's needs and will serve as a legacy for generations of sailors to come.

Life Membership is reserved for those who have made extraordinary and enduring contributions to MYC. Graham has done that and more – giving not only his time and knowledge but also his heart to the club. His recognition is richly deserved.

STEPHEN TEUDT - THE VOICE AND VISION OF MYC

If Graham's story is one of quiet engineering brilliance, then Stephen Teudt's is one of leadership, passion, and the power of community. Stephen joined MYC in 1991 and immediately threw himself into the life of the club, joining the Sailing Committee and shaping the future of MYC in ways that still resonate today.

Most notably, Stephen is the founder of our Twilight Race Series – the event that has become the beating heart of MYC. What began as his vision has grown into one of the most popular twilight sailing series in Sydney, bringing thousands of sailors, families, and friends through our doors over the decades. It's no exaggeration to say that Twilights define MYC, and that legacy belongs to Stephen.

Stephen has also served in an extraordinary range of roles: Twilight Director, Offshore Race Director, Principal Race Officer, Training Officer, Auditor, Club Licensee, Vice Commodore, and Commodore. Few members can claim such breadth or depth of contribution.

Beyond the titles, it is Stephen's spirit that stands out. His famous race presentations – filled with stories, laughter, and that booming "LADIES AND GENTLEMEN!" – transformed simple prize-giving into celebrations of camaraderie and friendship. He has been a tireless advocate for youth sailing and a champion of female participation, ensuring MYC is inclusive and forward-looking.

Over more than 30 years, Stephen has been a guiding force, a steady hand, and a voice that carries across both the harbour and the generations. His Life Membership is a fitting tribute to a man who has given so much of himself to MYC.

LOOKING BACK, MOVING FORWARD

The 75th Anniversary Ball was more than just a ball. It was a celebration of everything MYC has stood for since 1949 – community, sailing, friendship, and service. It was a chance to honour the giants whose shoulders we stand on, to welcome new partners like the Saltwater Veterans, and to look forward to the next 75 years with pride and optimism.

To everyone who helped make the night a success – from organisers to donors, from the Legends Panel to our keynote speaker Evie, and most of all to our members – thank you. You are what makes Manly Yacht Club special!



A WORD FROM DUTY ROSTER CO-ORDINATORS PETER & DANIELLE

Welcome to another season at MYC!

As a volunteer club, we rely on the commitment and help of every yacht. Without this, racing simply could not happen. This season it is more important than ever that every yacht is ready and has a suitably trained Race Officer (RO).

Most boats are <u>likely to be rostered</u> and will be required to supply an RO as per 7.30.8, so please make sure you and your crew are confident in the role. RO training is your opportunity to gain that confidence, understand exactly what is required, and help keep our racing running smoothly.

Training is not just for those new to the RO role. It is also a great opportunity for experienced ROs to refresh their knowledge and upskill. Remember, 7.30.8 requires that you are able to run any Race Committee, including scratch starts.

We really need every yacht, owner and skipper to step up. Without trained ROs, we face serious challenges in running races. As a friendly reminder, under 7.30.10, a boat unable to meet its duty obligations may face disqualification.





NSW GOVERNMENT GRANT

Our president Warwick McKenzie recently applied for a NSW Government Grant as part of the Community Building Partnership Program, and Manly Sailability has been awarded a grant of \$20,000. These funds are intended to enable us to update the dinghy and to purchase a new Hansa 303 sailing boat.



We have already taken delivery of a new clinker dinghy, and an electric motor will be delivered shortly, to ease the difficulty of rowing to and from *Charlie's Chariot*, especially in strong winds. An order has been placed with the manufacturers of the Hansa 303's and in October we will receive a new Hansa, with yellow hull and sails (naming competition to come).

James Griffin, our local member

and strong supporter of Manly Sailability assisted with our application and James, along with daughter Grace and assistant Kim attended our sailing day last Monday to learn about our plans for utilising the grant. Our deep appreciation and thanks go to James for his work in helping us obtain the grant.

Congratulations and thanks also to Warwick on driving the project and achieving such an important result; one that will ensure the continued update of our vessels and extend our capacity to provide a fulfilling and worthwhile service to our clients.



What's in a Name? by Eli Demeny Vin and Black Swan

Vin and Black Swan are historically linked, as they were both donated at the same time in 2012, coming via Cromer Golf Club. At the time our then President Judy Cole, was a champion sailor at the Master's Games, a great golfer and a member of Cromer Golf Club. However, their stories do not align completely, as Black Swan

was donated totally by Cromer Golf Club, and *Vin* by the family of Vin Gallagher, who sadly passed away suddenly as we were in the middle of arranging the boat donation, to increase our fleet.

Vin Gallagher was a very strong member of Sailability, coming down often to sailing sessions, and taking part in our regattas. He was very friendly with his neighbours including one of the Group Homes, where Vanessa lived. He built a friendship with Vanessa, and for many months, *Vin* was the only person she would go sailing with, and the "red boat" the only one she would approach. Later, as time went by, we found a different Vin for her to sail with, and she finally felt happy to be in the boat with the other Vin and has now progressed to the point where she is happy to sail with anyone.

The other boat delivered in July 2012 was *Black Swan*, the fluoro boat, whose name reflects the black swan logo of Cromer Golf Club, and also coincidentally, the Hansa class black swan insignia which is on all Hansa sails. The story about *Black Swan* is related to the Invictus Games, which took place in Sydney in 2018. Sailability Manly donated the use of our 303 sailing boats for use at the World Invictus Games and each of our boats were allocated to defence personnel that were competing in the Games.

Training was conducted at Pittwater for several weeks and the boats then housed at Rushcutters Bay. Early every day they sailed around from Rushcutters Bay to the sailing area close to the Opera House and it was an incredible sight to see the Hansas racing between the Botanical Gardens and the Harbour

Bridge. The sailor of *Black Swan*, nicknamed Bear, was the winner and was so chuffed at his success, he had a tattoo on his arm, to be with him for the rest of his life.



DUTY ROSTER REMINDER



Hello Skippers, Boat Owners and Members,

First off – congratulations! First off – congratulations! If you're receiving this email, it means you, your yacht and crew have been selected to help make racing at MYC possible this season.

Yes, that's right – if you're a skipper or yacht owner, your boat *will* be volunteering for Race Committee (RC). And if you're crew, chances are you'll be helping out when it's your yacht's turn.

As most of you know, MYC is a volunteer-run club. Our racing simply wouldn't happen without Race Committee, and since we don't have a huge pool of non-racing volunteers, every yacht entered into a series will be scheduled at least once.

The good news? With a little planning, RC duty can be smooth sailing. If your boat is out of the water, away for delivery, or if key crew are absent, consider volunteering for that date instead – it might actually work out perfectly. The important thing is making sure RC is properly covered with **trained** volunteers.

Here are a few key things to keep in mind:

- The Race Officer (RO): Someone from your yacht must be able to act as Race Officer. It doesn't have to be the skipper or owner, but they must have completed the Race Officer course. (Next training is on Saturday 23rd don't miss it!)
- Robbie R drivers must have a valid boat licence and be trained with Operating Manly Support boats.
- **11** Helpers welcome: Crew, family, or friends can assist with RC roles. Just make sure they're suitable for the task.
- Swaps allowed: If your scheduled date doesn't work, feel free to swap with another boat (even across series) just make sure you organise it directly with the other skipper or owner, the Duty Coordinator is not responsible for organising swaps.
- Small crew? If your yacht doesn't have enough people to fill RC roles, it's your responsibility to recruit
 extra volunteers. The Duty Roster Coordinator cannot staff the RC for you.
- Rules reminder: If RC isn't fulfilled properly, disqualification is permitted under MYC rules (7.30.10).
 Last year we had a couple situations where RC wasn't adequately covered and other sailors had to give up their race so the race could go ahead. Let's make sure we don't have to use this rule this season.

Graham Hart and his team survived the blaze and continue to provide value for automotive servicing and repair, tyres, now MARINE battery system design and supply.








