President's Report

Well, Manly Yacht Club Members, I hope you all had a most enjoyable Christmas and New Year and that you are looking forward to the second half of the sailing season. The Club was open on New Years Eve and I hear that Club Members and the Diggers spent an enjoyable evening watching the fireworks. I spent the holiday period in Tasmania where the nearest thing to sailing was paddling my Kayak with grandchildren sitting in the fore and aft hatches.

Since my last report Sailability has been proceeding with the accessible toilet. The walls are finished, the tiling is almost complete and some of the fittings have been installed. Sailability is planning a grand opening with the Master Builders present. The standard of workmanship and the quality of the finishes are very high. This toilet will become the benchmark against which other accessible toilets will be judged.

I had hoped to report positive progress on the rigging deck but it is still travelling slowly. The Dept. of Fisheries has now become part of the Dept. of Primary Industries. In response to my last letter, an onerous condition requiring photographic monitoring of sea grass for a period of three years has been revoked, but another condition requiring a permit to affect marine vegetation still stands. I have been advised that it is in the best interests of the club to have this permit because then there will be no comebacks. So twelve pages of forms have been filled in and sent off with cheques to the value of \$310. Once we get the permit we go to visit Council.

'Reality' has been replaced. Keith Woodward has upgraded to a 40 footer called 'Aquarius'. I am looking forward to seeing this new addition to the Club fleet. No doubt she will feature in the offshore races as well as the usual club events.

COMMODORE'S REPORT

Welcome to the New Year and the second half of the sailing season which promises to be pretty exciting and very busy with regattas all over the harbour. Just a few weeks ago Vaucluse Yacht Club held their 75th Anniversary Regatta which was attended by some of our yachts and centreboards. By all accounts it was a well run event and everyone had a great time. This weekend sees our second Mini Regatta and I'm sure all those who haven't entered have received a white feather from Peter Mac. This regatta will test out your crew, your yacht and yourself - great fun and I'm assured there will be four races! Some of those Vaucluse boats will be gunning for us!

The beginning of March brings with it the Audi Sydney Harbour Regatta as part of Sydney Harbour Week. The organising authority for this regatta is MHYC but all the clubs on the harbour, including Manly, are assisting with the race management of this event. Two days of racing; free entry for those entered in club point score series; great beach parties afterwards. Anyone not racing but wanting to participate as a penciller or mark layer or flag raiser (if you've done the race officers course you'll know what that means), here's your chance to get up close and personal to the big IRC racers; the Sydney 32, Sydney 38, Farr 40, the gaggle of Etchells one design fleets and the PHS fleets out there - over 230 boats in one spot at one time!

Just a weekend to recover and our major event is on. You've got it...the Mikasa Women's Challenge. One of Manly Yacht Club's favourite events entertains 7 divisions which include spinnaker and non spinnaker, all female and mixed crews. This event attracts yachts from most of the clubs in Sydney Harbour and has been held continuously for 12 years with the same sponsor - both the Mikasa and Cristal D'Arques brands come from Arc International. We thank them for their ongoing commitment. The Mikasa Women's Challenge...a challenge, not only for the women but for the men who step off the boats to leave the all female crews "to it"!

The third race in the offshore race saw the fleet sail in the other extreme of the wind range compared to the first two races. It was champagne sailing all the way to Botany Bay and back with a light S/SE wind to start with, backing E and then E/NE towards the late afternoon. The fleet of 6 yachts went mostly out to sea chasing the current and stronger wind with Morna joined south of Bondi by TwoCan trying their luck close to the rocks and the beaches looking sailing the occasional lifts. Dances with Waves and Pensive decided at some point to check the other side of the course and quickly returned out to sea. The slower yachts did not time the wind shift all that well:-being able to put up the kite going into Botany Bay, however, having to beat to windward on the way back out- the yachts at the front of the fleet were able to two sail reach all the way out of the Bay.

All in all, a very pleasant, although at times a little frustrating, afternoon was enjoyed by everyone. On corrected time Pacific Breeze was able to squeeze in by Dances with Waves by 74sec and take first place.

AUSTRALIA DAY RACE TO PITTWATER



Another superb day of racing for the offshore fleet. It was great to see a fleet of 8 yachts for this race; the 6 from race 3 being joined by Ratty and Crow Bar. The start was rather slow with only about 7-8knots from the NE. Everyone, except for Morna, put up their kites right away

with Out There having a great run towards the Junction Bell.

Outside the heads, Dances with Waves and Pensive pulled away quickly with the rest of the fleet staying in touch for most of the race. Crow Bar decided early to stay out and they were rewarded by stronger and more consistent breeze. Abeam of Whale Beach Pacific Breeze, Crow Bar, Out There, Morna and TwoCan were still quite close together after three hours of sailing. The broad reach/run inside Pittwater provided most of the excitement for the fleet. Those who put up their kites after rounding Barrenjoey were met by a few bullets up to 25knots coming over Palm Beach. Further south the gusts moderated a little but the lack of concentration from a number of crews led to multiple round-ups along the way. Dances with Waves took line and handicap honours with Crow Bar coming second and Ratty, on their first offshore race, coming third on corrected time. The navigator's prize was collected by Bruce Hitchman by estimating his finishing time to within 20seconds. Congratulations to everyone for a terrific competition and to our handicapper who managed to limit the corrected time spread between the first and last yacht to 12minutes!!

The next and final race of the offshore series will be on Good Friday April 6th.





Who has right of way?

We all have Racing Rules of Sailing ("the Blue Book") and International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (fondly known as "Col Regs") on board as part of our Cat 7 (and above) Equipment Compliance and we need to know and understand these rules.

When competing against boats on the race course, the Racing Rules of Sailing apply. When we meet any other vessel on the harbour then the Col Regs and Maritime Authority requirements apply. A call of "racing" is

meaningless and futile when the other vessel is right of way vessel!

A vessel includes every description of watercraft used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on water.

So keep a good lookout for all other vessels, especially the hire kayaks in Manly Cove / North Harbour area.
