Please note on the back page of this newsletter there is the notice for the Annual General Meeting and the Election of Office Bearers for 2009-2010. In addition there is a Nomination form for the Board of **Directors.** Do not be backward about coming forward. The Board needs some new blood nominate now. Alternatively, if you have any spare time or skills which may prove useful to the Club, even if a position on the Board seems a bit daunting, let Christabel or me know. The Board needs assistants if it is to carry out it's duties efficiently.

The programme for next season includes refurbishing the venue, ie., that part of the premises which is hired out for functions and which generates income for the club. The Board voted \$15,000 towards the refurbishment at the last meeting.

Another project to be activated is the reorganisation of the boat storage facilities on the lower floor and the inclusion of sliding doors to the deck. This will enable some of the boats currently parked on the deck to be stored inside.

The temporary fence at the southern end of the deck is due to be removed and the Club does not have permission to put gates in its place yet. So members and organisations using the deck should make sure that all their equipment is secure.

The Manly Junior Sailing Association will celebrate 50 years of sailing this year (1959 -2009). Details of the Celebrations have not been finalised but it is believed MYC (the Club that invented the Manly Junior) and the Skiff Club (with a large fleet of Manly Juniors) will be involved.

COMMODORE'S REPORT



THE BATTLE OF NORTH HARBOUR

Q: What is the difference between an East Coast Low and a cyclone?

A: According to the Bureau of Meteorology, bugger all.

So, for dramatic effect, let's say the final race of the 2008-2009 Club Championships was held in cyclonic conditions, and the photo of Dee Smyth's steely determination in this newsletter shows it was no normal Sunday afternoon jaunt.

The series had come down to the wire, with the normally unflappable Davis Marina crew on Wild Life feeling the hot breaths of the sometimes flappable Two Can crowd in Div 1. Both were locked on 17 points after nine races. In the small boat division, any one of four - Kaotic, Occam's Razor, Beausoleil and Melody - could take the prize. The ECL slowly rotating its way to New Zealand would prove the decisive element. Division one really became a two-horse race when only Wild Life and Two Can, both throwing caution to the wind for eternal MYC fame, reported to Carlyle, itself battling the lop off Fairlight Beach as the sou'easter touched 25 knots. Division two, normally bolstered by a sturdier type of sailor anyway, managed to attract five starters: the above four for obvious reasons and Starship and Sip Ahoy, for no obvious reason other than they are masochists. Kaotic was the first casualty and packed up and went home without starting. The rest decided to battle on.

With backstays cranked on to breaking point and leech lines flapping, the two fleets set off over the Heads with huge swells rolling in. Melody and Beausoleil had reasonable starts, with the other yachts struggling to put in reefs - or were they considering a tactical withdrawal? Occam's Razor, an aptly named Duncanson Offshore design, soon wound in the might midget Melody at Lady Bay with the others in cold and wet pursuit. All yachts rightly kept their spinnakers in the bag on the downwind run to the Manly YA's as the breeze really kicked in. Wild Life, resembling an Oberon class submarine and just as wet, wasn't able to pole out a headsail and knew that without a spinnaker up their tilt at the championship would be over. Commander Davis

ordered all hands on deck for the next run, a longer leg from the Eastern Channel YA to what would be the shortened course finish line at the Manly YA's. Two Can, normally a light-wind specialist, looked to be handling the extreme conditions well. Meanwhile, the breeze climbed and the second casualty was the mighty midget, with the author chickening out after the little Dart took on a gutfull of ocean off Cannae Point. Dee and Eleni didn't take too much convincing, it must be said. Dave Fairclough's solid little Razor was cutting the fleet to shreds anyway, and he and his scurvy crew could taste the sweetness of victory and VB already.

With bailer boy Greg James working himself into a frazzle, the Davis's E-Boat surfaced at EC YA after nearly being rolled by a rogue wave near the Sow and Pigs and decided to roll the dice. Up went the red-andwhite kite and off went Wild Fire, with crew in tow. "This is the fastest I've every been in an Etchells, or a Toyota ute," shouted Commander Bruce above the din. It was break or breakthrough time, and Steve Teudt decided to follow suit and up went Two Can's bag of tricks. But it was not enough as the Etchells surged to the finish line like a homing torpedo to claim the race on corrected time and 2009 title. "The only way I could see where to go was through a tunnel of light on the bow ... either side of the boat was a wall of water from bow to stern," recalled Capt'n Bruce. "We spotted a kayaker but then lost him in the swells. The next time we saw him he was way astern." Occam's Razor likewise screamed over the shortened course finish line to take line honours and second on handicap (to Sip Ahoy) - good enough to give the MYC Rear Commodore and crew their first club championship title with 22 points from Kaotic (24) and Beausoleil (25). Third place in div 1 went to San Toy, with Graham and Maz happy to watch the last race from the safety of Dobroyd Head. Very sensible. Lastly, I'd like to take time to thank all the tireless helpers and volunteers who took time out to help run the Club Champs this year ... the unsung heroes of MYC. See you all again next year.

- The Spinnaker (working with the spinnaker, hoisting and dropping it, mark roundings)
