A bit of drama but Ginger raced again on day 2. Congratulations to everyone who entered the regatta which is the largest held on Sydney Harbour with over 300 boats competing. Commiserations to Bokarra for not winning the Audi but I think Iain, Colin and Marg had great fun at Eastern Creek driving the cars anyway. I'd encourage other boats to train up for next year's regatta – and if you race on Sundays, the entry to the Audi Sydney Harbour Regatta is free, so I expect entries for the 2011-2012 Club Championships and Summer Series to come rolling in. ## 'SEASCAPE'

Let me take you to Fingal's Cave on the inner Hebridean Island of Staffa, off Scotland's rugged West coast, where Nature, the Grand Architect, has constructed an awesome cathedral to the sea.

Formed entirely from hexagonal-jointed basalt columns, similar in structure to (and part of the same lava flow as) The Giants Causeway, in Northern Ireland. It's size and natural arched roof give it an eerie acoustic dimension, as the waves reverberate within the chamber. It's Gaelic name, Uamh-Binn means 'Cave of Melody'.

In 1772 naturalist Sir Joseph Banks discovered it, but it became known as Fingal's Cave when classical composer Felix Mendelssohn wrote 'Die Hebriden' (Fingal's Cave Opus 26), after visiting in 1829. Fingal, Fionnghall, meaning 'White Stranger', was the hero of an epic poem by 18th century Scots poet-historian James MacPherson. The legend has Fionn or Finn building a causeway between Ireland and Scotland. Take care when you listen to Mendelssohn's masterpiece, as he so exquisitely captures the mood and

power of the ocean, that one surging swell too many could spell disaster. Jules Verne was inspired to write Le Rayon vert (The Green Ray), in 1859, after visiting Staffa. One can picture the sun touching the horizon, as viewed through the depths of the cave, with the prospect of experiencing the mystical Green Flash, which is reputed to bring enlightenment and clarity of thought. If there were a visitor's book it would read as a whose who to the famous. Poets, writers, musicians and monarchs. Wordsworth, Keats, Sir Walter Scott ('Cliffs of darkness, caves of wonder, echoing the Atlantic's thunder.') Queen Victoria of course, with her love of all things Scottish, even 'Mr Brown', but let me reserve special mention for Joseph Mallord William Turner (Bill to his friends), the acclaimed English landscape painter (The Painter of Light). In 1832 he created a masterpiece, Staffa, Fingal's Cave. The seascape captured a hazy moment, when clouds of billowing spray are spewing forth from the cave, due to the dynamic surging nature of the ocean. when it was first shown at the Royal Academy it received great praise, but it remained unsold for 13 years, until an American buyer was found,

who bought it sight unseen. Nervously the dealer wrote: The quality of Staffa, 'A most poetic picture of a steamboat' would become apparent in time, but the buyer was baffled and disappointed by what he called the painting's 'indistinctness'. Turner unperturbed by such an unimaginative and unperceptive critique of his masterly colour poem to the tempestuous grandeur of nature, simply replied, 'Indistinctness is my forte'. Guess where I want to go for my holidays?

# ANTARCTIC ADVENTURE

## YOU'VE GOTTA DO THIS BEFORE YOU DIE...

I have just completed 3 weeks on Orion a small ship of 100 passengers & 75 crew from Dunedin to Antarctica & back via Enderby Is, Macquarie Is, Mawsons Hut & Campbell Is. Good weather most of the way ( for Antarctica ) air temp from 10 C to -1.5 C wind 35 to 65 knots & the ship handled everything extremely well. Difficult to dance on a rolling deck.

Full Antarctic kit includes 20bucks Bunnings gumboots, 3prs of thermal socks, thermal underwear top to toe, skivvies, ski pants, Orion red jacket & 3 prs of gloves all worn at the same time a la Michelin Man waddling along the snow imitating penguins! We did perform a full Cha Cha routine for the crowd on the Ship. 2 magic days in Commonwealth bay visiting Mawsons Hut, Lands End, John O'Groates, & being confronted by 100's of seals & 1000's of inquisitive penguins of various types.

At Macquarie Is we walked among the Seal Bulls Cows & calves, 5 metres distance is the rule but the seals would often come closer & one has to be careful around bulls fighting over their harem. The NZ Dept of Conservation does a wonderful job of preserving the natural environment, building walkways & developing programs to eradicate introduced species such as rats & rabbits. The seals were annihilated by the hunters in the 1800s but have now returned & fully recovered their numbers.

The penguins were something else again. Standing still the penguins would often waddle up & sniff & occasionally peck cos they are inquisitive little people & have no fear of human beings as we have not been



their predators for many years. Mawson's Hut was something else again - Walking into a hut that had been vacated 100 years ago & everything is exactly as it was left, just like the Marie Celeste & is maintained & slowly being restored by the Foundation.

The experience at Cape Denison with all the ice, penguins, seals Antarctic birds was a truly magnificent one - it exceeded all our expectations. To be inside Mawson's Hut 100 years after being vacated and to witness that eerie silence, his lone pillow and chair was awe inspiring.

It was only 1 degree below zero which initially surprised us, but it is summer there and warmer temps are to be expected... The midnight sun was romantic and reminded us of the Northern hemisphere with its long nights.

Only 100 people at one time & 750 people per annum are permitted to land on the Australian Antarctic peninsula and quite often the weather stops them from landing. However, we were extremely fortunate in that all factors were aligned and we had perfect



conditions-calm, sunny, clear weather for great zodiac landings and we managed 2 full days at Mawson's Hut. We were in 7th heaven.

Shore expeditions were conducted by a team of 9 scientists & environmentalists including those well known Antarctic sailors Don & Margie Macintyre & an Antarctic exploration leader Di Patterson all of whom gave daily lectures in their specialist fields. The team made sure there was no cross contamination & all clothing was sanitised on leaving & reboarding the ship.

Finishing the excursion with a 5 day car trip from Dunedin to Christchurch via Queenstown, Twizel where we happened on an exquisite Farm B&B overlooking Mt Cook (the highest mountain in NZ & still covered in snow in the Summer ) Lake Tekapo & finishing in the seaside village of Akaroa.


In addition to all the working bee cleaning and painting, it is a pleasure to report most of the racking and tender storage layout is near finished and the down stairs area is looking great.
