COMMODORE'S REPORT

MYC has just participated in another Try Sailing Day,

thanks to the efforts of organiser Murray Bailes, the juniors, Sailability, Manhattan, Pohono, Ratty, Twocan & Esprit and other volunteers. This day is put on by the Boating Industry Association to introduce new juniors and adults to our great sport and it was great fun to show some keen newbies a great day on the harbour. This year we restricted our intake to just those that had pre-registered an interest, so we had 55 adults and 8 juniors from the local area keen to try sailing. Already some of the participants have come back to sail in twilights, enrolled in training and have taken membership forms to fill out.

Speaking of membership, remember that all your racing crew need to have YA membership so that they are insured for racing. Newbies get 3 races trial and then they must join a YA affiliated club and they must keep their membership current. Skippers please take note and ask your crew if they are current, so that you don't expose yourself and the club to liability in the case of an accident.

The 4th twilight of this season was a special event as it was held in commemoration of Nigel Holman, who passed away 5 years ago. Nigel raced his many incarnations of MYC 2 Cuckoo's Nest widely, including a famous victory in the tough 1993 Sydney to Hobart. Nigel's Imogen donated to the club a small horde of fine rum that Nigel had won, plus a \$500 charity donation to be chosen by the winner of the race. Thus in addition to our normal Pepper Tree Wine sponsors, the 4th Twilight was held in commemoration of Nigel and it was great to see Poets Days sailing with a few of Nigel's mates wearing Cuckoo's Nest shirts!

But a little embarrassingly, it was my boat Esprit that won the race, so I'm sipping a nice Bundy OP rum while I type this and have selected the Australian Marine Conservation Society (http://www.amcs.org.au/) as the charity for the \$500 donation.

More of the rum horde was given away as prizes in the raffle and it was good to see that a number of our active volunteers were prominent among the winners (Karma!).

However, Nigel's rum horde is a gift that keeps giving because among the bottles were three collectables of considerable value. Thus we are currently planning another event, probably in the new year and hopefully involving MHYC and the CYCA, with these bottles as prizes of the race and/or a raffle. Stay tuned!

On the subject of sailing with other clubs, there are a number of other initiatives under way to increase our interaction with other clubs, which I think is a great way to enhance our sailing enjoyment with a bit of variety. Firstly we have been invited to have our yachts and lasers participate in the Vaucluse Yacht Club Regatta, which has been going for over 70 years and is held for a mixed fleet much like our own. The regatta is on Saturday 23rd February, so put it in your diary as it would be great to send an MYC contingent.

Also this weekend (the 10th November), MYC has sent 9 Women's sailors to a Yngling coaching event and mini regatta. The first day has just concluded in 20-25kt conditions and I know Jan is definitely now appreciating the OP aspect of our twilight prize. Tomorrow is the regatta and I'm sure our girls will be getting in some great training in preparation for our Women's Challenge March 24 (Entries are now open for the WC via www.myc.org.au - please get your entries in EARLY!).

Finally, it's also very important for us all to invite other clubs, boats and sailors to our own special events like the Women's Challenge and mini regatta. Please beat the drum of publicity with any boats and sailors that you know and make sure you challenge them to enter!

MYC JUNIORS NOVEMBER UPDATE

We are a month into our season and the Juniors have made a lot of good progress. We seem to attract the blustering southerlies every Saturday which isn't helpful to a fleet of sailors still trying to remember what the main-sheet does. The start has been eventful to say the least.

In week 1 we managed to nearly sink an MJ, put the RIB out of action and knock out one of our parent's teeth. It was meant to be a nice 10 knots but it built up to 15 and we had boats capsizing everywhere. No injuries and all sailors learnt a lot.

The next week the whole fleet was rigged up ready to go but the coaches had to pull the pin as it was just too windy. They spent the afternoon doing capsize drills and then had to de-rig and go home.

In week 3 there was plenty of wind again and we went out only to lose 2 boats to instant capsizes. A few tears and quick boat/crew shuffling and we got them all out there for a good test of character.

Week 4 saw our first day of sub 10 knot breeze. Finally the kids could go through the motions slowly and have some fun with their sailing. A few interesting close calls with the big skiffs doing their sprint series in the same location as us – we had one of our MJs call starboard on a skiff and lucky they did too. We did our handicap-setting practice races and all went well with no major catastrophes. The next day some hardy sailors backed up for Try Sailing Day – a successful day working with Sailability and taking the odd kid out for a test-drive.

Week 5 and the wind was back – gusty as ever – 15-22 knots from the south. So this time we called it off before rigging and did some land drills, a lot of race start practice on the deck and some rules of racing. So race 1 of the point-score series was cancelled. That leaves 5 spring races to complete in 3 weeks – interesting.

Weeks 3 and 4 saw a visit from a YA Class Development coach - Sam Ellis. That was brilliant as it gave us some extra help in the coaching ranks just when we needed it. Thanks YA and the MJ Association – Sam was great value.

Week 4 was a big session for us. We had our Juniors BBQ and a visit from none other than our new member, Malcolm Page — I think he may have won a few Olympic medals also. He generously gave time out of his hectic schedule to talk to the kids and show them some photos and of course, his 2 gold medals. He is a great inspiration to kids and parents alike and we applaud MYC and others responsible for getting him involved in our club.





We now have **24 kids and 18 boats** in the squad. All parents are pulling their weight and doing a great job working together. We have some great new racking for our old and newly purchased dinghies – Ian and helpers have installed extra racking for 20 odd dinghies – some on wheels. The sheds have a new feel and a good buzz about them now and we are really starting to feel like a formidable fleet. We are hoping to send 3 MJs to the state championships in late November and there is a PJ regatta to follow in February.

There are still some growing pains with the Juniors but that is to be expected given our stellar progress. Overall, when you look back to 2 years ago we have made some massive progress thanks to all involved. We are always grateful to the club, the yachties, Sailability and to Manly Sailing for their support. We are all keen to keep this going and make it a sustainable venture into the future.

It's like they can't make up their minds whether they want to remain a mild southeasterly or shift to a full-blown nor-easter. They threaten to fill in, then just as quickly shift and die out.

So when the gutless breeze was coupled with a lumpy sea, a few wayward marker buoys and a 16ft skiff state title heat, it was little wonder the third race of the club championship was a test of endurance that would have worn out Ernest Shackleton.

The first hiccup came at the start when the pin-end buoy decided to drift on to the reef off Fairlight point. The Old Man's Hat mark then decided to throw a spanner in the works and duly took off to NZ via the rocks at North Head.

(The Old Man's Hat, if you didn't already know, is a large flat rock that is teetering in the edge of the cliff to the west of the gulch on North Head. Interestingly it is surrounded by carvings made by long-departed residents of the Quarantine Station).

Let's face it; from there the race became a lottery in a washing machine in the slop under the OMH.



Any boat that could keep a semblance of boat speed was advantaged, so momentum was helpful. The smaller boats just bobbed around like corks and some took nearly four hours to complete the course.

In the end Bella took the handicap honours over Melody and Old Habits in div 2, while Wildlife got the Pepper Tree Wine from Esprit and Dances With Waves in div 1. Kaotic and Dances were the gun boats in their divisions.

Never had a finish line looked so welcome. Our everhumble Robbie R driver Manny has sworn on his wooden leg and glass eye that the OMH mark will never drift again.

We trust they will enjoy a memorable celebration.


TRY SAILING
