PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Without a January Board meeting, it has been quite a while since we've met as a Board but that doesn't mean that there hasn't been a lot of activity over the 'holiday' break. Some historical, some futuristic.

A key aspect was some history - which detailed the volume and value in both monetary and volunteer time that has gone into the club over the last couple of years. In a recent summary of this activity it has been confirmed that we have spent just under \$200,000 on major works and accompanying these major works is over 430 volunteer hours (under the supervision and involvement of our Club Manager, Peter Robinson).

This is in addition to all of the hundreds of hours provided by key members regarding minor maintenance and operational issues that spring up in the running of the club (particular recognition of our Club Captain Colin Cameron and Peter Robinson for jumping quickly onto these). And on this point, there is always room for more members to volunteer and share their skills through the many opportunities to become involved.

Looking forward is 2020. This is our strategic plan horizon as it coincides with the renewal of the club's lease with the Manly Council.

As mentioned in previous newsletters, our legal advice is that we have a robust Memorandum of Articles and Articles of Association, which allow the Board to address key issues with the management of the Club.

We will be redirecting the energies that would have been sunk into the investigation and writing of a new club Constitution, into the strategic planning process and the ongoing relationship with our 'Landlord' (the latter lead by Stephen Garmston).

Our newsletters are a valuable indicator of the vibrancy and activity undertaken at the MYC and with all of these areas of administration the club Board will be looking to investigate, improve, expand, stream line and in many cases, introduce new activities and facilities. Bring on the second part of this sailing season and 2020.

Over the past few months there have been a number of significant changes around the Club however, I doubt many of you would be aware of them. Under the advice of Ken Terrens we had a number of upgrades done to the network cabling throughput the Club.



Since then Ken can often be found disappearing into the ceiling above the Hall or standing somewhere looking far off into space. Actually he is installing a security camera system for us and when he stares he is imagining what the camera will see. Hs frequent visits to the ceiling space are not for a Cat (5) Nap but rather to redirect the cabling installed at the time the new roof was installed.

The office staff has been on their toes as Ken set a camera up in the office to see if he could review the camera from off site. We have a couple of cameras still to be put in place and when completed the system will allow for certain members too log in and view the perimeter of the Club from home. This should assist with security, reduction of vandalism especially Graffiti and allow us to replay any event where an accident may have occurred.



Ken is a tireless behind the scene volunteer and as a result of his efforts with security and networking within the club we hope to be safer and with networking able to meet the requirements of potential corporate hirers of the hall.

PITTWATER YHA MINI REGATTA ROUNDUP



Initially I was disappointed with the small no. of entries (8) to make up our regatta considering the effort made to invite boats along but come the day it didn't seem to matter at all!



The day was picture perfect and it was so enjoyable for so many different reasons. The committee was second to none setting a great little course from Reef Beach to Manly – windward leewards. We were able to have 1,2,3,2,1 laps as per the suggested format with each race starting and finishing seamlessly and only a short break between races to catch our breath and to feed and water the crew.

Lovely flat water, the cove produced enough swing and light and shade to give the helmsmen and tacticians something to think about and the spinnaker legs set perfectly downwind so as all boats had to put in at least one jibe to make the port/starboard gates.

And everyone had someone to race against – having to sharpen their skills and teamwork to keep their position or catch the next boat.

The racing was sailed with plenty of spirit and loads of sportsmanship, which made it pleasurable and competitive at the same time. The start line was short with just the right amount of room to accommodate the small fleet. There were numerous breaks of the line which only meant that boats were trying their best to be right on the line at the start — fantastic!

One competitor in fact broke the start twice — Shear Magic — (didn't learn from their first mistake!) — they won the coveted and inaugural 'BIGGEST MUG' award generously donated by the captain of the 'Concordia' especially for this event! Another of our special awards was for someone who left us with the BIGGEST IMPRESSION — this was awarded to Matt Miles trimmer for Kaotic. He was clocked by the boom on the last jibe of the day which left him with a small 'impression' on his brow — didn't feel so small at the time hey Matt!!

The wooden spoon award (we have all had our turn at this one) and also should have the most consistent award was won by Bokarra – Colin graciously received his mini golf package and promptly replied that Greg Norman started his career this way as his was originally going to be a synchronised swimmer!

So there were many tacks and spinnaker ups/downs and jibes and crew caught up in spinnakers and spinnakers caught up in crew! It was a lot of fun with 'Pam' setting a cracking pace each race and the rest of us scrambling for the minor placings. But it was a handicap series, so no one knew who was the winner till the presentation.



COMMODORE'S REPORT



The Sailing Committee has been conducting a review of our racing series to consider what (if any) changes should be made for next season. The guidelines of the review have been:

- Don't fix it unless it is broken. Things are pretty good so no change for change's sake
- Just because we always have, does not mean we always will. Change can be considered if it is justified.
- Let's do well what we do well! No need to chase new boats or new fleets, let's focus on making a good offering for the boats/members that we have. If more boats come, great!

Club Champs

Division 2 has always been a difficult mix of small and large boats, which tactically sail entirely differently (e.g. Czech Mate can take Bokarra's wind, but Bokarra can't take Czech Mate's). We've tried putting some boats (e.g. J24s) into Division 1, but they end up sailing on their own. Thus we would like to consider sailing the CC in 3 divisions:

- 1. Division 1 would contain the fast racing boats of the fleet and would be more or less the same boats as this season
- 2. Division 2 would be the 20 footers including boats like the J24s, S80s, Bella, Melody, Taxi, etc. As these boats are very much of-a-type. It would be good for marketing purposes to give this division a name like the "tenacious 20s".
- 3. Division 3 would be the cruising 30 footers like the Northshores, Beneteaus and generally the heavier displacement boats that don't compete in div 1, but are too big for div 2.

Summer Series

Some of the SS courses are a bit long and too windward leeward in nature, so the courses should be reviewed to keep the SS as a good stepping stone between the twilights and Club Champs. The courses should include some longer legs and some reaching legs, plus no more than 2 spinnaker legs per race.

Marathon Series

Currently we have 3 marathons per season including the Nigel Holman race. Is this too many? Should we make these handicap starts to strive to get boats finishing together to allow for a better BBQ afterwards?

Also, MHYC have their Chaos Cup, which is a marathon race all the way to Abbotsford and back. It is on a Saturday, but could be fun to include that in our Marathon series?

Twilight Series

The sailing and courses for the twilights do not need any significant changes. However there have been many suggestions made about improving the access to the dinner afterwards. One oft repeated suggestion has been to provide a tender/shuttle service from MYC. This is a definite possibility but we need to know in what mode boats would like it to operate:

- Just delivering skippers and crew to boats in the Manly cove area?
- Doing a few runs of skippers to North Harbour from MYC, so that skippers could park at the club before racing?
- Do runs to/from North Harbour so that the presentation can be attended, but the cars left in the north harbour car park.

If you would like a tender service, then please respond with exactly how and when you'd like to see it operate.

Offshore Series

We could reschedule our offshore races so that instead of being spread throughout the season (and clashing with other clubs offshores), so that we instead have a short season of offshores races that occurs after the Summer Series is complete (typically March & April).



SYDNEY HARBOUR REGATTA

Having just returned from the Geelong Festival of Sail, I can vouch that regattas are a lot of fun both on and off the water. Sydney's own regatta is coming up in the form of the Sydney Harbour Regatta, 8-9 March, hosted by MHYC with help from clubs like MYC.

The SHR offers a wide range of sailing: inshore and offshore; passage racing and windward leewards; grand prix racing and classic boats. There is a class for every boat and I encourage all MYC boats and crew to participate in this fun event that gets most of Sydney's fleets together. The beach party afterwards is also a good event to mingle with other sailors.

If you can't sail, then MYC will also be providing a race committee and volunteers. So if you want to put those race management skills into action or just observe the conduct of a large regatta, then please contact me to be part of this event.

Dinghies

The club is critically short of space and we are looking to find storage for more centreboards and support boats. One idea suggested is that we could reduce the number of dinghies stored at the club if a few club dinghies were provided!

We'd like to hear if you would be willing to give up your dinghy space and use a shared dinghy?

Child Care

If there is any demand for childcare during any of our race series, then the club can probably assist in providing facilities and other assistance.

It was a classic race on Copernicus - as in no wind instruments and no internet! Last minute repair to the mast (to fix a split D2 fitting) resulted in a drill or rivet through some cables! You can see us going up the mast during the race to try to fix the wind speed, but that only resulted in us losing wind angle as well!

Considering the lack of instruments and a failed set, we decided not to run with the storm kite in the NEer across Bass Straight. We instead went for the poled out #2, yet we constantly did 12-14kn with a max sustained run of 20.2 knot!!

This gave us plenty of rest to handle the westerly that smacked us Saturday night don't know what we saw (no instruments). but were a little over canvassed with 2 reefs and storm jib (the only video is a very dark image of the roll cloud going over, then we were too busy to film).

We came through the westerly in good shape and good position, but then screwed the pooch down the east coast of Tassie with a course that was neither in nor out, so we got the worst of the set and wind hole, yet were still late getting the new wind. We don't talk about storm bay and the river was really tricky with tide whirlpools and light winds from all directions. The video shows us finishing under kite (set 3 times after iron pot), yet the boats catching us from behind are reaching on the other board!



But as the song says in the video - I can't remember when I never had so much fun!



THE ADVENTURES OF PENSIVE

Sydney to Flinders Island

It seemed to take an eternity but finally Pensive was ready and we pushed off at 2pm on the last Monday in January to start of a voyage we hoped would take us as far south as Hobart. Aboard the amazing 11.8m sloop Pensive were the crew of Pam and Bruce Davis.



We day sailed our way down the coast riding the summer north east sea breezes stopping over night at Jibbon Beach, Jervis Bay, Bermagui, and Eden before making a crossing of Bass Straight to House Bay on Inner Sister Island just off Flinders Island.

Nearly all sailing was in a north easterly sea breeze which built every afternoon and on occasions required a reefed main. The sail to Eden was short at only a little over 40 NM but was done in a light south easterly.

The further south we travelled the more abundant were the sea birds requiring Pam to spend long hours with the bird book to make accurate identification. There were dolphins, one pod welcoming us to anchor in Jervis Bay and a seal having a pre-lunch nap at sea.

We had one wardrobe malfunction when the old blue spinnaker that had struck terror into the hearts of our MYC competitors for more than decade ripped from head to clew and fell in the water. It was a sad moment pulling it back on board knowing we would have to put it down.



Our crossing of the Straight was celebrated by landing on Inner Sister Island. We walked the beach and took a swim before going up to the old house and airstrip. Inner Sister had been a sheep run for many years but is now abandoned because of low prices and the high costs of operating on a remote island. The Cape Baron Geese reclaimed the island and stroll up and down the air strip as if they own the place, which of course they once did.

Flinders Island to Triabunna

We took a few moments to reflect on our Bass Straight crossing and thought of those great sailors who preceded us. But fore front in our minds weren't Cook, Flinders or Boudin, no we had Zyner, Nixon, Terrens and all the others who had sailed on Copernicus, departing Davis Marina to compete in the Hobart Race. Year in year out they had made the crossing arriving in Hobart in four days while it had taken Pensive six days and we had only sailed as far as the tip Flinders Island.

As slow as our progress had been, Pensive's crew were determined to keep going. The weather intervened and we moved to Palana to dodge a southerly and then to Killiecrankie to dodge an easterly finally to Spike Cove, on Clark Island, for a southeaster. Here we were greeted by a bush fire that was going to consume the whole island.



From Spike Cove we could see the Tasmanian coast and after an early start next morning we found ourselves running down the east coast in building northeaster with a poled out jib. We didn't stop at St Helens or Wineglass Bay because the Northeaster was too strong. After more than a 100 NM in daylight hours we anchored just inside Schouten Passage. Next morning we amused ourselves with beach strolling and bush walking. Lunch was taken at Hazards Beach followed by a walk across the tourist track to Wineglass Bay. This is very popular with day walkers from Coles Bay and the nearby Coles Bay would be our overnight anchorage. The northeaster increased overnight and Pensive dragged her anchor a little on the course sand and gravel bottom. By early morning the bureaus forecast of up to 30 knots at first from the northeast and then the west was being exceeded. Rather than being caught, later in day, in Coles Bay with a strong westerly we left in late morning for the 25 mile run to Triabunna.

On the way to Triabunna the wind gusted to 40 knots from the north and Pensive sailed under bare poles at 5 knots. Nearing Triabunna the wind went to the west and was steady at over 40 knots gusting to 50 knots. Our course was now taking us upwind to the harbour entrance and so the engine was started. The seas increased becoming very short steep breaking waves about 4 metres high. They swept across Pensive's decks partially filling the cockpit. For two hours Pensive motored up wind under almost full throttle at a little over one knot.

Eventually it was possible to turn Pensive to starboard and enter the harbour at Triabunna and anchor in the lee of hill as the wind finally eased back under 40 knots in the open waters. For the record the following wind speeds were recorded.

Maria Island 44 to 52 knots Hobart 44 to 70 knots Pensive Max 49.7 knots








