

Mooring Madness!

It is getting increasingly difficult to get insurance for a boat stored on a mooring, especially in the area of Manly Cove and Little Manly.

Whilst there are some efforts by the BIA, Maritime and Yachting organisations to address this issue and/or reform mooring standards and procedures, there is still a lot we can do ourselves to help improve the situation.

The best thing we can do to help the situation is to stop boats washing ashore on a semi regular basis, as happens in Manly Cove and Little Manly. Prevention starts with our own boats and it is vitally important that we ensure our moorings are sound and get them regularly serviced. Note that it may not be wise to wait for a service reminder to arrive from your mooring provider, as these have been known to be sent late, which has resulted in boat losses on at least two occasions. In addition to the mooring, it is just as important

to check that the fitting on your boat is sound, as some recent stranding have been due to cleat failure rather than mooring failure.

Of course all sharps and potential wear points need to be protected as well.

If you see another boat that is looking precarious on it's mooring (e.g. growth on it's rope, line off it's roller etc.), then please contact the RMS and/or the club, so that it can be reported and fixed before it becomes another statistic in the insurance companies calculations for providing insurance or not.



HISTORY – SOLING YARNS

BIRTH OF THE SOLINGS AT MYC

A sailing Mum was disappointed that the yacht on which she was crewing was sold. So she decided to get her own yacht to enter MYC events. Her name was Ivana McAlpine. She had completed a sailing course at the Australian Sailing School at Spit and had been impressed with the lively open hull Olympic Class Yachts called Solings. The school offered the kind of membership that included private use of the boats if you booked in advance.

She booked a Soling, was ferried to the boat and sat waiting for the crew to arrive. They were students at the sailing school but she did not know them. When they arrived she made an announcement "This is the first time I have ever taken control of a keel boat and now is your chance to get off." "No worries", they said and stayed.

The Soling sailed to Manly, was late for the start but completed the race and eventually sailed back to the Spit in a strengthening breeze. One of the crew was an airline pilot, full of confidence, Ivana thought, with nerves of steel. But his knuckles were white by the time they got back.

Back at the Club questions were asked about this snappy little yacht. Fast, cheap to buy and an Olympic class. Mike Jeffreys, an excellent MYC sailor, came for a sail in the following race and was hooked. He bought AOLIS and Ivana bought TOYBOY. Then he and Ivana planned a Soling take over of the club.



Why do AOLIS and TOYBOY have the same sail number? Confuse the Race Committee?


They approached the Board to build up a Soling class at MYC and strengthened their case by citing the fact that the Sydney Olympics were approaching, seven years to become world class, and the yachts were relatively cheap, sporty and fast.

The Commodore, Bruce Davis, and Secretary, Pam Davis and the President Gene Scott all agreed and sold their current boats and, within a few months there was a fleet of four. Others followed...

Ivana Gattegno

1999 AUSTRALIA DAY REGATTA

Whilst Solings won the trophy for the most one design yachts in the Regatta, Ivana McAlpine (Gattegno)and her crew of David Parle and Hugh Barton won the Soling



But there was a snag. Only clubs of great standing with the word Royal in their title could display the trophy in their own premises. MYC did not count. However, Ivana had a plan. Although skippers only were invited to the award ceremony Ivana got permission to take her mother, Milena, a sweet and innocent old lady, who was in Australia on holiday. It was Milena standing in for Ivana who went up to the dais and received the trophy. Then, all smiles, she walked straight out of the building taking the trophy with her.

The trophy remained in the custody of MYC for about one week before being returned. During that time it was photographed in the hands of the winning crew. This historic photo, when found, will be published in the Club Newsletter.

2000 SYDNEY OLYMPICS

The Sydney Olympics have been covered in a previous article titled 'Events of Note' but because it is so relevant to the Solings at the Club it is worth a bit of repetition.

Manly Yacht Club embraced Solings prior to the Olympics. At the State titles in 1996 there were eleven Solings competing and nine of them were based at MYC. Bruce Davis secured a third In Trio Astarde and Ivana McAlpine in Toy Boy was fourth. In 1998 there was a Soling Blue Water Classic. All the big names were there and Neville Wittey was the winner. Bruce Davis was a credible 10th. MYC sailors competed with the worlds best in regattas and trials on Sydney Harbour. Overseas Olympic competitors leased MYC Solings to train on Sydney Harbour.

The significant role that MYC played in the warm up to the 2000 Olympics is demonstrated in this extract from the 164th Australia Day Regatta Handbook:

"Manly Yacht Club

The summer of 1999-2000 promises to be one of the most exciting times ever for the International Soling class, with the focus on three selection regattas in late December to decide the crew to represent Australia at the Sydney 2000 Olympic Games.

Not only are the (MYC) crews heavily involved in the lead-up to Sydney 2000, but much work is being done behind the scenes, including the organisation of selection regattas, on water judges for the match racing section, race committees and measurers who have volunteered their time to help an Australian crew win gold.

The NSW championships for the Soling Class and the Australia Day Regatta should be an important lead-up regatta for Sydney 2000. Last year the Soling Class won the prestigeous Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron One Design Trophy for having the most one design yachts racing on Australia Day, with 13 boats...

Three divisions are planned for the 2000 Regatta – Championship, nonhiking and antifouled.

Further information from Ivan Fitz-Gerald."

Seven MYC boats took up the opportunity of free entry in the Middle Harbour Chaos and Bedlam Cup, joining 36 MHYC boats and 14 Super 30s in MHYC's version of the marathon, which goes on a direct course up the Parramatta River, passing under the Gladesville bridge to a turning mark at Abbotsford.

The forecast was for light winds, which made the 25nm course look very daunting, although understanding the MHYC handicap start sequence were probably just as daunting for some of our boats. The narrow confines of the river channelled the breeze so we all started well without infringing other boats or the exclusions zones too badly (for newbies).

With a 4m swell coming in the heads, there was a lot of surge in the sound and it was difficult for many boats to settle. Yet despite the large range of starting times, most boats soon had racing companions and many individual duals broke out as the fleet swapped the surge of the sound for motorboat chop around the bridge. Except for *Bella*, who as one of the smallest boats in the fleet started early and was not seeing any other boats. She started thinking she had the date / course / time wrong! *Shear Magic* and *Twilight Express* were probably a bit out of place in the handicaps, but at least had a good OD design pairing to race against.

It's always fun flying a kite under the Harbour Bridge and most of the fleet were able to do that, except of course for the non-spinnaker entries like *Moonraker* (kids on board) and *Pompadi* (2 up), for whom Bedlam Point was starting to look a long, long way.



But soon after the Harbour Bridge, the seas flattened and the wind was again being channelled by the river, so it was good dead running no matter which way the river turned. Great for the symmetrics and polled out head sails, but *Bella* and *Esprit* with their asymmetric were seeing a lot of either bank and getting lots of gybe practise.



In the end, *Esprit* decided to run wing and wing with the asymmetric, which kind of worked even if it did confuse many as to which board we were on. *San Toy* also doesn't fly, but had entered in the kite division and her big main helped her out up the river.

But all boats except one of the Super 30's manage to avoid touching any of the unfamiliar real estate. *Rapid Transit* had a bit of a delay on a mud bank for a while, but managed to refloat with hopefully no pride damaged.

The turning mark at Bedlam Point allowed the boats out front their first good look at the chasing pack. It also allowed the boats out the back to see that there was an end in sight to the seemingly endless turns of the river. *Bella* way out the front, thought she had a chance, but the breeze started to die as she passed Fort Denison and *Esprit* was the first of many to run over her, but she narrowly held off *San Toy* for the finish. The light breeze convinced *Pompadi* not to make the left turn for the finished and instead sailed straight home for a DNF, but all other MYC boats ghosted up the river for the 3rd kite run of the day to the finish.

Esprit loved the flat water moderate breeze conditions and grabbed 2nd in Div 2, with the rest of MYC making a respectable appearance throughout the results. Having a combined event made it a fun day with different boats to race against and we'll look to have the same exchange deal next season.

Bruce Davis, Ivan Fitz-Gerald (President of the NSW Soling Association), David Parle (Sec of the Australian Soling Association) and Paul Glasser (President of the Australian Soling Association) became official measurers for the Solings. Pam Davis, Bob Buchanan and John Corby were measurers for the Finns.

Manly Yacht Club became the base for all the support boats other than the Committee boat and Club members acted as delivery drivers for the RIBs borrowed from the MSB. "There is 80 kilos of chain in the bow but don't open the throttle too fast or you will flip over backwards" was the advise from the MSB officer who handed over the RIBs.

Manly Yacht Club was seriously involved.

'I'M NOT JIBING THAT BLOODY SPINNAKER FOR ANYONE'. So, we sailed by the lee and we did make it, just. And we won by half a metre."

Robert was the fore-deckie because he had sailed on a Soling before. During the race Neil, amid-ship, threw himself to the windward side during a tack and disappeared over the side. He totally missed the foot straps. By the time the yacht returned to pick him up he had fought off the crew of a cruiser who were determined to rescue him and was refusing a beer offered by another craft.

Later on with the spinnaker up they were bowling along at a fine pace when suddenly the spinnaker was yanked out of shape. Brian looked behind. There was Robert, about 5m back in the water, hanging on grimly to the spinnaker sheet and creating a fine bow wave of his own. Neil reeled him in.

They completed the series, but they didn't get a podium finish.

MANLY YACHT CLUB ART EXHIBITION SEPTEMBER 2015


Have you been inspired? I created a piece in 2005 anticipating a re-run of the very successful show in 2004. It seems I 'jumped the gun' by 10 years!




