



Greg Taranto Honorary Secretary

Yachts must be inspected for either a cat 4 or cat 7 equipment audit from 9am. Attendance should be indicated by the Yacht Audit Booking Form. Inspections will be either at MYC or Davis Marina and will be conducted in the order of arrival.

Equipment should be laid out prior to inspection in the order of the audit form. The form should be completed and signed by the boats representative prior to inspection, together with the signed <u>Safety Declaration</u>.

Equipment Compliance Audit Day For Yachts Saturday 29th **August 2015**

Summer, and the day for audit inspections to be carried out are fast approaching so now is the time to start to be ready for the inspection and making sure all the necessary equipment is in position, up to date and in good condition.

Please make sure you have your new Handbook and have read Page 27, "Sailing at MYC. Section 5.2, Yachts".

Since last year's audit there have been some minor changes to requirements for our categories. However, this can change again at any time so keep in touch with the YA website to guarantee that you are up to date with the requirements.

Audit Forms:

You can download and print your necessary audit form from the MYC or YA website but maybe leave it until near the end of the month so that any future changes will be included on the form.

Inspections will be carried out on the day at both Davis Marina and MYC jetty from 9.00am to 1pm.

For those attending Davis Marina, unless you are a Marina client, please wait completely away from the Marina until you are called to the Marina work bay. Non client boats should not use any other Davis Marina berths. Boats will be attended to in order of arrival.

Manly Yacht Club jetty should be readily available for mooring.

On presenting your boat please ensure that forms are complete, all necessary equipment is in good condition, "in date" and neatly laid out for checking. This step saves confusion and the auditors valuable time. Please be aware that the auditors are all volunteers and give up their valuable time to carry out the inspections.

A fee will be charged to boats not attending for inspection on this day.

Check List to consider



Fire extinguishers must be readily accessible and remember mass does not determine BE rating. An inspection certificate may

be requested to be provided on the day, or at any time.

If you will be sailing in the **Twilight series** make sure the navigation lights are in good working condition.



Normal saline is required for all categories (check for size). Sunscreen needs to be in date so check before inspection. Crepe bandages (2) need to be 75mm x 1.5mm and scissors must be stainless steel.

Sharp knife needs to conform to be capable of cutting high modulus fibre rope.





All inflatable lifebuoys, life slings and PFDs shall be checked and serviced in accordance with manufacturer's instructions. A certificate of service may be requested.

Non-inflatable PFDs need to be checked annually.





Flares in date.

A durable stowage chart shall be displayed in the main accommodation for Cat. 3 & 4

All category boats need to carry out routine training on board, especially drill for man overboard, reg. 6.01.2.

NB. As from 1st July 2015 all 406 MHg EPIRBS must be GPS capable.



MORE FROM THE COMMODORE...

TO



OR NOT TO



It can be a very difficult decision for a race committee to abandon a race based on a forecast. Our rules say:

Races will not be started when in the opinion of the Race Committee: the maximum wind gust averaged over 3 seconds exceeds 20 knots for juniors or 25 knots for Lasers or 30 knots for other classes; extreme weather conditions are probable; there are other significant safety concerns.

When the observations prior to the start are showing gusts over 30 knots, then it is pretty easy for the RC to form such an opinion. However it is much harder to do so based on a forecast when the observations are showing fine sailing conditions!

Weather forecasting is not a perfect art, so there will be times when forecast bad weather fails to materialize and a race can safely be held.

So how should a RC decide if a bad weather forecast could be discounted, when the possibilities for miss matched observations include that the forecast is just early, late, different, or just plain wrong?

The best approach is to consider how you would argue that the club had exercised its duty of care if there was an incident during a race.

It is one thing to be able to say something like: "A strong front had been forecast, but it had already passed / it had gone to the south / it was delayed, so we believed there was a good opportunity to run a race", but it is an entirely different thing to try to argue: "The BOM had been predicting an Antarctic Vortex to hit the city and to last a few days, but we thought they got it wrong because it wasn't winding in the morning". I.E. if a RC can honestly say why they think the forecast was not 100% correct, then we can consider getting a race off. But if the weather is just being unpredictable, then it is very hard for us to race when there is a Strong Wind warning or worse in place. Other extreme conditions can also be taken into account, such as cold, heat and even dust or fog.

As a recreational club with a very mixed fleet, we should try to err on the side of caution. It is better to regret not racing than to regret racing when we shouldn't have. Even then, there will be (and have been) times when we get it wrong, so each individual boat should also be making their own determination if it is safe to sail and if they are prepared for all conditions that they may meet on the day.

YA POWERBOAT HANDLING COURSE 31/05/2015

On a cold and dull Sunday morning Felix, our instructor met myself, John, Cecilia and Stuart from MYC, at the floating pontoon. We were there to learn powerboat handling a prerequisite for the YA safety boat operator course. After introductions we set off, taking turns driving the RIB, on our way across the harbor.

First stop was Sow and Pigs reef for revision of the main IALA marks found in the harbour. We continued on to Cremorne Point where we had the first man overboard drill. Felix made it a little more realistic than usual and we really had to look for the 'man' a 5L white plastic bottle!

I was asked to steer and instructed to drive three times round Fort Denison. Somewhere on the way we lost another 'man' overboard and again had to retrace our steps to look for him, with me instructing the crew. Luckily he was eventually found!

After morning tea at Darling Harbour we practiced our parking skills in the berths at Cockle Bay, one at a time. First we went in starboard side to pontoon, then portside to pontoon, then backwards to both sides and finally a tight 360 in a berth. A very steep learning curve for me, and interesting exercise in a very public place!

A late lunch was eaten at the RMYC Squadron in Kirribilli and then we headed back to Manly, still taking it in turns to practice our driving skills.

Once at Manly we picked up Charlie's Chariot and practiced towing a boat tied alongside the RIB. It was very interesting to work out how differently the RIB moved with another boat attached, and a useful skill to have even though I hope I never have to use it. The day ended back at MYC.

Felix was an interesting and entertaining instructor and had loads of useful tips, which could be applied, to any powerboat. I personally found the day a lot of fun and I have learned many new skills and gained some valuable experience.

A DAY OF DEVASTATION

5.45pm Sunday the 20th November will be ingrained in many people's memories for quite a while to come.

All members who raced that day will remember the varying wind strength, the direction from all points of the compass and the temperature jumping up and down all day.

It was a frustrating days racing and the cold beer at the club was incredibly inviting. What was to come no-one was able to predict.

As many members and crews sat out on the deck, the rain just started to spit, the most incredible sight was to be seen coming out of North Harbour. In the space of 30 seconds, a giant white wall of churning salt water spume and wind came spewing out into Manly Cove.

The wind went from 15 km/h to in excess of 145 km/h as members and guests ran for cover in the hall. Tables, chairs, anything not bolted down went flying in this 10 minute rampage that nature put on.

Whilst damage to the club was minimal, the worst was to be discovered at Davis Marina.

The mini cyclone had come in from the West through North Harbour Reserve and through the Marina before blowing across Manly. Sue Pocock's beloved yacht "Cruzan" was on the large slipway having its yearly scrape and anti-foul when it hit.

Witnesses said that this "brown twisting wind" came out of nowhere, picked up the slipway with its 20 ton steel hulled yacht still in place and threw it over on its side.

It was only by luck that no-one was working on it at the time. There was no noticeable damage to the boat but the slipway is a mess of twisted metal and wood.

For all members who know Sue, "Cruzan" is not just a boat, but a home. Everyone has offered Sue and Roxanne (Sue's daughter) a place to stay but this is a devastating blow for them both. Not to forget Bruce Davis, our club commodore, who now has his largest slipway out of action for who knows how long.

In retrospect, if this squall had come in a few hours earlier, the whole of the MYC racing fleet would have still been out on the water. These freaks of nature are here to remind us how really insignificant we are.






