## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

### Recent actions by your Club Board

As you can see in this newsletter, the Club has embarked on a strategy of procuring 10 Open BIC boats. There are two revenue streams being pursued; a grant from the State Government (Sport & Rec) and a matched amount from local businesses via a naming-rights fund-raiser. In all, our target is \$40,000. This will be used primarily for the purchase of 10 BIC boats but also the ancillary items needed with our grown fleet - storage and mobility.

While there are now 12 BICs sailing at the club, these 10 new club-owned boats will be used for entry-level training before sailors progress on to their own privately-owned boats.

Other actions taken by the Board include the recently completed refurbishment of the hall bar area (now all stocks and bar materials are housed in this area); the production and distribution of new membership cards; the twilight racing dinner arrangements with BlueSalt Catering (and Robbie R tender service); the support of the Green Fleet to fill a much-needed training gap between the Manly Sailing program and our JCRP; and the hall hire marketing activities (pricing and promotion) as well as ongoing hall repairs following wear and tear.

Last year the club migrated to a flat membership structure, which also reduced the fees for boat owners and slightly increased the fees for previous Associate members. This restructure and fees adjustment was part of an initial change, which is now moving into stage 2. The industry (YA) model, has the annual sailing calendar running from September to August. MYC has traditionally had a May to April financial year and the membership year mirrored this. We are now going to migrate to the September year start for membership (while retaining the club admin financial year of May-April). As part of this process, the Board voted unanimously to freeze the membership fees but to run membership renewals for a 17-month period to bring us into line with a new-year start of September 2017.

This means the membership renewals coming out in May, will be for 17 months, pro-rata to the frozen 2015/6 rate. The Adult membership fee will be the current \$21.66 per month x 17 = \$368. In September 2017, the annual fee will be \$21.66 x 12 (\$260) plus CPI. Worth noting is that at this rate, MYC is still one of the lowest club membership rates in Sydney.

Also on the membership front, the Board has received a surprising amount of (late) membership applications and renewals from last year. We attribute this to the reminder message sent out by Greg Wilkins, our commodore, about the need to ensure all sailors have the YA insurance cover included in membership. This cover protects both the crewmembers and the skippers if any personal injury occurs. While we all strive for safe sailing, we also know how quickly accidents can happen.

The Summer Ball is coming up, book your tickets now to save disappointment. While dressing up (70/80's theme) is encouraged, it is not essential. I'll see you there with my blue suede shoes on.

## MYC Sailors Hold Their Own at Open Bic World Cup Safety Beach, Victoria

**Manly Yacht Club** was well represented by 6 junior sailors at the Open Bic World Cup held at Safety Beach Sailing Club in Victoria from **27 Dec - 3 Jan 2016**.

The MYC sailors in the Under 13s were ...

Oliver Martyn (38th), George Thompson (23rd), Sam Blair (36th), Thomas Rees (53rd)

And in the Under 16's were ...

Jack Reid (34th) , Will Divola (17th)

The regatta started with the 130 competitors marching proudly under their national flags, a welcome to country ceremony and an official opening by the local mayor, Councillor Graham Pittock.

The countries represented were USA, Germany, Czech Republic, France, New Zealand, Switzerland, Japan and Australia.



Port Phillip Bay sprang back to life on New Year's Day with 20+ knots and heavy wind chop. Sailing from the back of the bus in these conditions was critical to avoiding a spectacular nose-dive and catapult into the bay. Oliver Martyn and Sam Blair soon found their groove in the stronger conditions and started to steadily climb places.

Unfortunately the wind continued to build into the final day of the competition and the final 3 races were abandoned due to 25+ knot conditions.

The Open Bic World Cup was a great regatta which provided our MYC sailors with valuable experience, the opportunity to meet new friends and to sail with a truly world class fleet.

I know the guys are looking forward to the second half of the MYC Club Championships so they can continue the competition and pass on what they have learned to the entire MYC Junior Fleet.

Finally, special thanks to the MYC Committee for letting us take Nigel Holman to Safety Beach, without it we wouldn't have been able to watch the racing or support the sailors on the water.

Also special thanks to Dolly Divola, A.K.A "Super Coach" for all his support prior to and during the regatta.

Competition was fierce, particularly on the start line with around 60 boats in the Under 13 and Under 16 fleets. The MYC sailors quickly got a sense of the skill and training required to compete at the top of a world class fleet. For example, the Frohmann brothers from Germany, who finished 1st and 2nd in the Under 13's, train most days of the year, often in dark and freezing conditions. It is no wonder they were capable of holding prime position on the start line for minutes before the gun and were super quick up and down wind. In the Under 16s Kristen Wadley from Tinaroo Sailing Club in QLD again showed why she is a 3-time world champion with 4 firsts and 4 seconds across 8 races.

The first few days of racing provided hot conditions with 5-15 knots of shifty breeze. Will Divola managed to secure a 6th and 4th and was looking like a real contender. Unfortunately most of the Under 13s ended up with a DNF in the 3rd race after the wind swung 180 degrees and died leaving all but 12 boats unable to finish within 10 minutes of the winner. We quickly realised that with top class sailors at the top of the fleet a 10-minute cut off made it essential to stay close to the top of the pack to avoid the DNF.

Day 3 was nearly 40 degrees Celsius and all but 1 race for the Under 16s was abandoned due to a lack of wind. Day 4 was used for the Open Bic signature Adventure Races and the international teams round robin, which Australia eventually won after 52 mini races.

#### Tactics and Strategy Golden Rules

- Be at the start on the start
- Navigation !..... Know the course and marks
- Wind goes left, be on port tack! .... Wind goes right be on starboard tack!
- Always stay in pressure
- Always sail towards pressure
- Cross when you can and get control of fleet.
- Have a game plan and stick to it
- Have a plan 'B' just in case it goes horribly wrong
- Don't get greedy
- Stay in touch with the fleet. The sport is sailing not gambling.
- Consolidate your gains not your losses
- Stay in clear air
- Don't tack unless you have a reason to
- When boats are on different tacks 1 boat is wrong , 1 boat is right.
- Look before you tack and gybe
- Sail the longest tack first (general rule)
- Percentage sail the fleet.
- Always be assessing your risk management
- When in front reduce lateral distance to the opposition. When behind, increase lateral distance to the leader.
- When in front try to sail the next boat towards the lay line, which gives them less opportunity to pass. When behind try to sail the leader towards the center of the course.
- When in front parallel sail the opposition
- Stay between opposition and the mark and or new wind.
- Always be the inside boat at the bottom mark rounding
- Sail knocks downwind... just as important as the shifts upwind
- Keep you head out of the boat as boat positioning is most important.
- Keep focused and stay positive. Don't let frustration effect your decision making.
- Don't overlay marks, or underlay

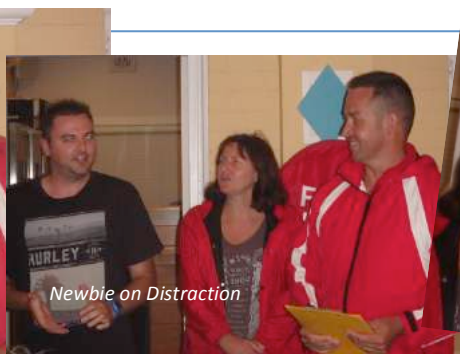
