Volunteers are needed to help out Manly Yacht Club, a non-commercial community sailing club racing junior dinghies, adult lasers and Yachts. The club needs volunteers to officiate our racing and a training/introduction course will held **Sunday 27th August from 1pm** - for both members and new volunteers, or if you need a refresher.

MYC sailing races are held on Friday twilights and Sunday afternoons. Races require from 3 to 7 volunteers to officiate in various tasks: time keeper, buoy laying, boat driving, radio operations, course selection, flag and sound signals etc.

No experience required and volunteers can either be sailors or non-sailors. The club offers training and mentoring to help volunteers learn the roles. Both on water and off water roles are available.

All races end with a social gathering (either dinner or afternoon BBQ) for which volunteers get free food and a drink!

COACHES REQUIRED

Manly Yacht Club requires coaches for the 2017-18 Season to support its Green Fleet program and we are inviting qualified coaches to express an interest in joining our team.

Coaches will need to hold an Australian Sailing Coaching qualification (or equivalent) as well as a working with children check and a boat licence. The Green Fleet will sail on Saturdays and Sundays as detailed in the MYC handbook.

The successful applicants will work with our head coach Marcus James to deliver quality instruction to the 30 children expected to enrol. Depending on experience and qualification the wage will be about \$25 per hour.

- ➔ **MYC Handbooks** are at the printers but will be distributed on the Equipment Audit and Registration Days, the first couple of race days and then by post. Meanwhile the racing calendar is "live" and online at www.myc.org.au and the online handbook is here <http://www.myc.org.au/forms/1718/MYC-Handbook-2017-2018-compact.pdf>
- ➔ First Race for Yachts and Lasers is **Sunday 10th September** so skippers, it's time to check that your insurance is up to date; you have passed inspection and you have signed the safety declaration, and then sign on for some racing.
- ➔ If you know that you are only sailing one or the other series, put your name down on the Duty Roster for the one you aren't sailing – **no race committee, no racing!**

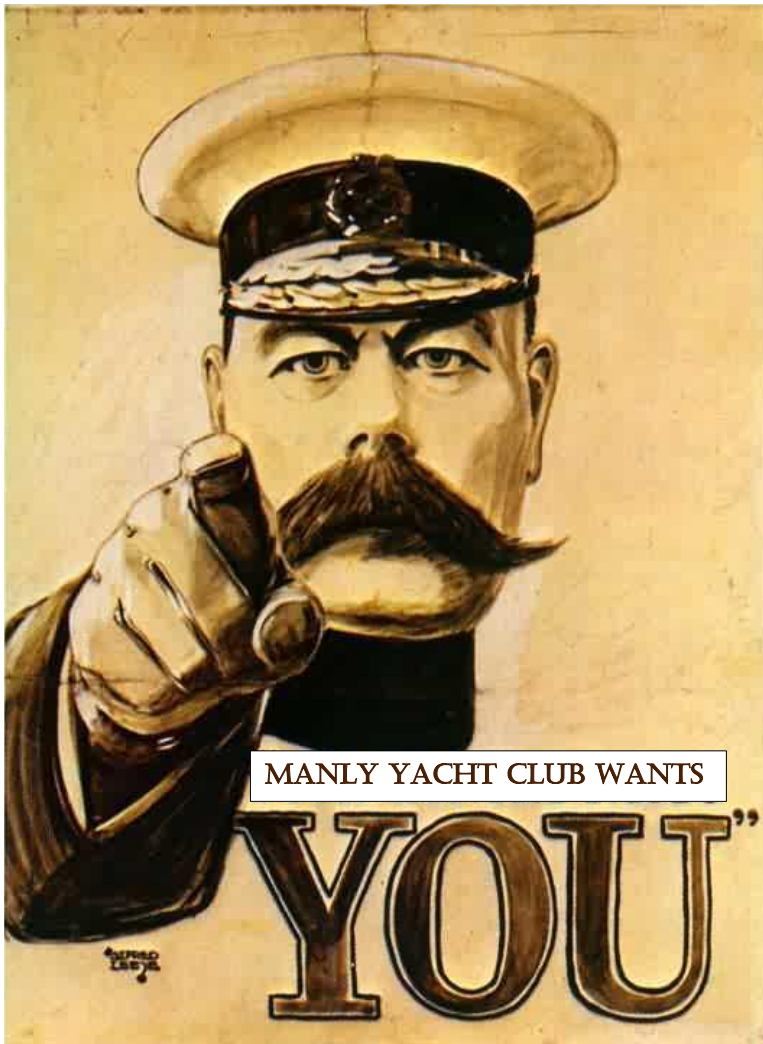

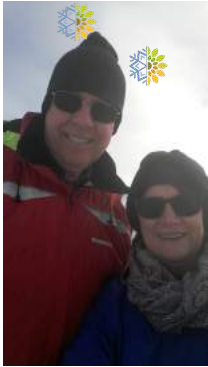

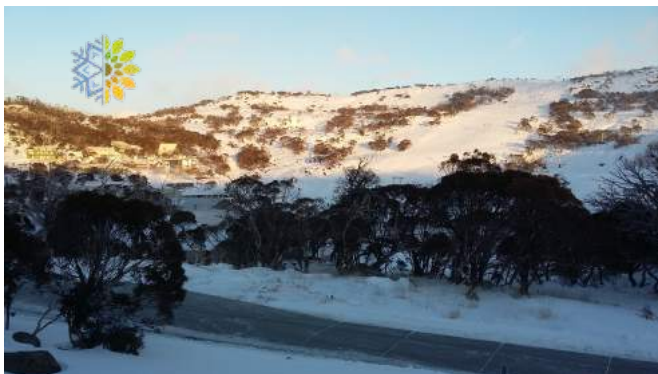
The facilities, food and camaraderie during our stay was terrific. We kept the wood burner fire stoked into the night and amazingly caught up with folk who new folk we knew - small world.

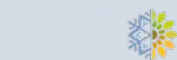

First Aid Course for 5 Sailability Branches at Manly Yacht Club

Sunday, 2nd July was the date set aside for Sailability NSW volunteers to attend our tri-ennial First Aid Course.

5 branches were included among the students: Manly, Pittwater, Crystal Bay, Yarrabee, and Middle Harbour volunteers, mainly people who were updating their skills from yesteryear.

Our trainers were Maz and Gary from First Aid Plus. The students had 6 weeks to work on their Course Information Book, learning the skills necessary, and answering a range of questions to cover the course in their Workbooks, which needed to be handed in on the morning of the course.

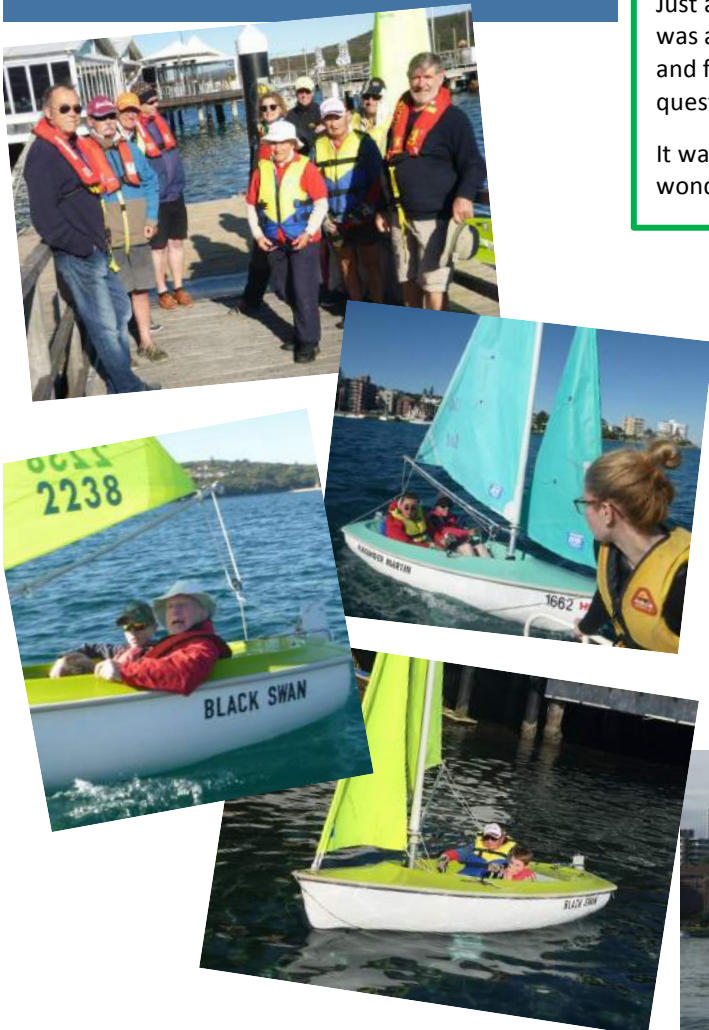
Once the course got going, it was non-stop from early in the morning to late in the afternoon. We practiced bandaging and use of slings, CPR on mannequins, the legal aspects of being a First Aider, treatment of bites and stings.

Then came care of a person who looks as if he is having a stroke, a heart attack, an anaphylactic episode, etc.

Just as we were about to feel too exhausted to go any further, there was a practical session to check our use of the defibrillator and CPR, and finally, a short but very perceptive exam, using multiple choice questions to examine our knowledge.

It was an extremely exhausting and busy day, but ended with wonderful results for everyone.
