GREEN FLEET WRAP UP

Each sailing season a handful of high achieving children graduating from the sailing school are recommended to our clubs Green Fleet. These are children who have performed well in the school's courses and have shown an interest and dedication to the sport of sailing.

The Green Fleet is made up of kids who can sail from the pontoon in light to moderate weather and handle their boats with a degree of proficiency. At the end of their time in the Green Fleet they will have consolidated their understanding of tacking reaching and running (the points of sailing) and be able to cross a starting line and sail a simple course. Each year a number of Green Fleet kids graduate to the racing fleet and eight kids successfully made the switch this season.







At the beginning of this season 17 kids, with their parents, attended the junior's registration day for the Green Fleet where paper work was checked and fees paid. Both kids and parents received a briefing on what was required of them in terms of rigging, de-rigging, launching and retrieval of the boats.

It was stressed that the parents have a significant role to play in the smooth running of the sailing days. The kids were a mixture of last year's Green Fleeters and new recruits and they have been making good progress under the watchful eye of head coach Marcus. By the end of May when their season finishes there will have been 26 sailing days.

The Green Fleet is further divided into four sub fleets. On both Saturday and Sunday afternoons the Optimist Dinghies are put to use by those new to the fleet, the first timers. Once these children have built up enough skills they move to the Pittwater Juniors and sail on Saturday afternoons. Those who are nearly good enough to join the race fleet sail on Sunday afternoon in the BIC Sports Dinghy.

During the summer school holidays Manly Sailing School advised that six of their students were very capable of entering our Green Fleet if there were room. This prompted a shake out of positions; children were promoted from one sub fleet to another and some to the Race Fleet to make room for the new comers. It also meant that parents were encouraged to buy boats as the club's boats were put to more and more use. Because our young sailors make such good and fast progress through the sub fleets these reassignments are necessary and a regular feature of the program.


I must mention the quiet achiever Geoff Reid who would have been in contention for quite a few podiums however due to a back injury which ruled him out for many of the final heats.
