Our own club member achievements, though different in scale were no different in the sense of passion and achievement. The Presentation Night celebrated achievements at all levels within our club. It remains one of the few events where all divisions of the club come together and recognise the achievements of many through our racing programs in this our favourite sport.

I was not able to attend the Presentation Night and I heard that time was a premium but I would like to draw your attention to an article within this newsletter providing the background to our Good Citizen Award. Members would have received my email recently with the draft copy of our Member Protection Policy and recent decisions regarding the investigation of a sponsorship policy. Feedback on the MPP is still invited and the intent is to ratify it at the AGM at the end of this month so it is part of all new membership applications and renewals.

This MPP is to create a club-managed process to support members and create a safe sporting environment. To date we have had an informal complaint handling mechanism or relied on the national Australian Sailing procedures. A recent complaint with the club followed the AS procedure and has been resolved through mediation. Another shout out to get in your diary the AGM being held after the fourth Winter race presentation at 5 o'clock on the 30th of June.

It will be my last as President as I am stepping aside to give others a turn.

### **HOW MANLY YACHT CLUB WORKS!**

# Manly Yacht Club is incorporated as a limited liability not for profit Company, which is overseen by the Board of Directors that includes:

- President (Cary Budd), who convenes the Board Meetings, sets the agenda and is ultimately responsible for the financial running of the Club.
- Treasurer (Lisa Callaghan) manages the Club's finances and cash flow and supervises the bookkeeper.
- Club Captain (Finn Irvine), who is responsible for the Club's off-water sailing assets (jetty, boat storage, etc.).
- Boat Director (Bruce Davis) manages the maintenance of the Club's floating assets.
- Maintenance Director (vacant) works with the Club Manager to oversee the maintenance of non-sailing aspects the clubhouse.
- Events Director (vacant) oversees the bar, catering and the Hall Hire Service Provider.
- Commodore (Muir Watson), Vice Commodore (Jason Bond) and Rear Commodore (Greg Wilkins), represent the Sailing Committee on the Board.

# The Board of Directors is also responsible for supervising the work of our paid employees / sub contractors / tenants:

- The Club Manager (Barry Miflin) deals with matters such as insurance, bills, quotes, tradesmen, supplies, council, maintenance, etc.
- The Book Keeper (Kate Saunders) runs the accounting system.
- ➤ Hall Hire Service Provider (Sorrell Lambie) operates the Club's venue hire business and provides the Club with our primary revenue.
- Sailing School (Finn Irvine) are tenants that rent premises within the clubhouse and provide a learn-to sail service for juniors and adults plus a yacht charter and holiday service.
- > Sailing coaches for the junior racing and green fleets.

# The sailing aspects of the club are managed by the Sailing Committee and the race officers that report to them:

- The Commodore (Muir Watson) holds the Club's Aquatic Licence, issued by the Roads and Maritime Service, which lays out our operating procedures, safety plan and makes clear the duty of care and chain of command for all on water activities. The primary mechanism for enacting these operating procedures is the Sailing Committee, which is convened and run by the Commodore.
- The Rear Commodore (Greg Wilkins) is the previous holder of the Commodore title and is involved to offer sage advice and to cover up the mistakes and deficiencies of the Commodore.
- The Vice Commodore (Jason Bond) is the Commodore in training.
- Each race series is managed off the water by a Race Director, who writes the Notice of Race (NOR) and SI (Sailing Instructions) and then organizes the Race Committee to manage the on water activities of each race day.
- The Sailing Secretary (Jan Bartel) manages the race entry system and checks the insurance, payments and audits of all entries.
- The Principal Race Officer (Stephen Teudt) supervises the training and quality of the Club's Race Officers and our race procedures.

### Finally come race day, the Sailing Committee hands over to the Race Committee:

- The Race Officer is the individual responsible for all racing on a given day and makes the decisions about courses, start/finishes, abandonment etc.
- Timekeeper is the race committee member(s) who records the start/finish times of each competitor
- The support boat will have 1 or 2 race committee members who lay marks, relay message & people and stand by to assist if possible in an emergency (however they are not a rescue boat).

All positions on the Board become vacant at the AGM on  $30^{th}$  June 2019. Nominations for positions on the Board are now open ... see next page

### THE IMPORTANCE OF SAIL NUMBERS



Winter Series Race 2 gave the race committee something to think about... two "phantom boats" crossed the start line, and later, finished correctly. One boat had no sail number; the other had a sail number not recorded on the start sheet. Both boats were eventually identified and recorded in the results.

Meanwhile, near South Head, a body was being recovered. Listening to the radio communications on CH16, the sail number of the yacht retrieving the body was the easiest identification for Water Police to locate that yacht and transfer the deceased to the Police launch.

Occasionally you may come across a yacht, which may display an MYC sail number. Sometimes that yacht has long since left the club or the boat has been sold to a non-club member.

MYC has been advised by Australian Sailing, that after the bad weather of a few days ago and on inspection on Wednesday 5 June, several AS buoys have either been damaged, moved or are missing.

- Obelisk Bay 33 49.854s 151 15.981e Mark is been found missing and will be replaced as soon as possible once the swell drops down. Expected completed by 14/06/2019
- Rose Bay Buoy 33 51.742s 151 15.978e Mark will be removed until further notice.
- North Harbour/Fairlight Buoy 33 48.150s 151 15.534e Mark will be removed until further notice. (Manly East/West and 40 Baskets Buoy are still in position) (Fairlight Buoy = 40 Baskets in MYC Marks of the Course... Ed)
- Chowder Bay North and South, Cannae Point Marks are sitting low in the water and were scheduled to be cleaned this week however due to to the weather this has been delayed. Expected to be completed mid next week weather permitting. Upon inspection yesterday (5th June) all are sitting at least 400mm out of the water with high viz tape well clear of the water line.

All other marks are in very good condition and floating high in the water and easily seen. An update will be sent through once the above work has been completed.

### AN EVENING WITH LISA BLAIR

Manly Yacht Club was privileged to host an evening with solo yachts-woman Lisa Blair. Her account of her solo, non-stop, unassisted circumnavigation around Antarctica in 2017 was dramatic as she conquered the challenges of 50-knot winds; huge seas and isolation. Her ability to face



and survive a de-masting during the last stages of her journey was part inspirational and part unbelievable. With knowledge, skill, preparation and support Lisa showed us that anything is possible.

Lisa is presenting a one day offshore Master Class at RMYC Pittwater on 14 July.



This one day master class is drawing on the unique offshore skills that Lisa had developed while she sailed solo around Antarctica and around Australia.

Lisa will be sharing her first-hand account of her de-masting, building a jury rig, and transferring fuel from a container ship as well as storm survival techniques such as use of drogues and heaving too.




